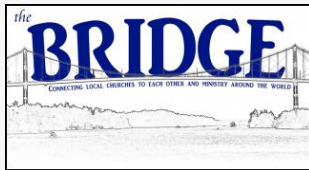

PARKING

Parking will be in the **Oncenter Garage and Open Lot**, accessible from both Harrison and State Streets. The parking attendants will have a

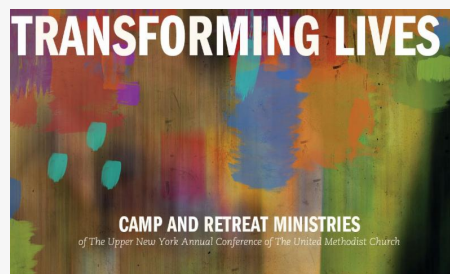
Eligible clergy members of the Upper New York Conference (deacons and elders) in full connection can place their names back on the ballot at any time. See the form for specifics about that process.
