HEZEKIAH'S HANDS ORIENTATION FACT SHEET

Greetings and welcome to HEZEKIAH'S HANDS, Bradford County's home repair ministry. Thank you for your willingness to help improve the lives of some needy homeowners. Contained here are some pertinent pieces of information that are designed to answer some basic questions and make your time with us more enjoyable and productive. Please do not hesitate to ask if you have questions that are not addressed here. Our contact person is Nancy Hughey @ 570-265-3767.

HOMEOWNERS --- are our primary focus and our MAIN goal is to communicate the love of Christ to those we are working for. Our attitude, behavior, language, work ethic and interaction with others needs to reflect Christ ---kind of like the WWJD (what would Jesus do) philosophy. This is God's work and we must live and act in a manner that demonstrates His message of love and hope. Extend kindness to the homeowner, take time to get to know them, and be careful not to criticize the existing conditions.

THE PROJECT --- is described on a "work order" that details the 'who, what, and where' information. A crew leader will head up your team and direct the process from start to finish. Team work is important here as various activities require people helping each other. Safety for you and others is always a number one concern. Please do not compromise this. If you are not comfortable doing something, ask for help. Our crew assignments are made to provide the skilled people needed to accomplish the job.

OUR VOLUNTEERS --- are the backbone of our ministry. Your willingness to give of your time and talents to serve allow us to do what we do. Bring a sense of humor and your pleasant, friendly attitude with you always ready to present a feeling of encouragement and hope to those whose lives may emit the opposite. For your own good, wear comfortable and modest clothes that you don't mind getting dirty or soiled. (Painting is something we do a lot of.) Sturdy/comfortable shoes are important; sandals and flip-flops are not advisable! Pay attention to the weather, but still come if it's raining. Dress accordingly. Bring water, your lunch, and sunscreen and bug spray if you use those items. You might want a pair of gloves, a hat and shades to shield the sun. As far as tools go, bring a measuring tape, hammer, utility knife and a pencil. You may find that a cordless/battery operated drill is helpful as well as paint brushes and putty knives. Your crew leader will have or make available the power saws and larger tools required for the project. The crew leader will also be in charge of the materials.

THE WORK DAY --- starts at 7:30 AM at the Towanda Presbyterian Church (TPC) where the crews are organized. Please don't leave until all arrangements are made. After corporate concerns are addressed, we will have prayer before departing. At the end of the day, please plan on eating the evening meal (free of charge) with all the day's volunteers at the TPC's fellowship hall. One of our participating churches will provide a nourishing, tasty dinner and this hour of your time allows for sharing of the day's events as well as a time for our organizers to assess the needs for the next day. Our plan is to eat at 5:00 PM, followed by a short devotional, and dismissal of the group by 6:00 or shortly after.

OUR MOTIVATION --- comes from a need that exists in all parts of Bradford County and a desire from within to serve God. Following King Hezekiah's example in 2 Chronicles 31: 20, we aspire to do "what is good, and right, and true before the Lord our God." Matthew 5:16 wants us to "let our light shine before men that they see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." Praise GOD.
