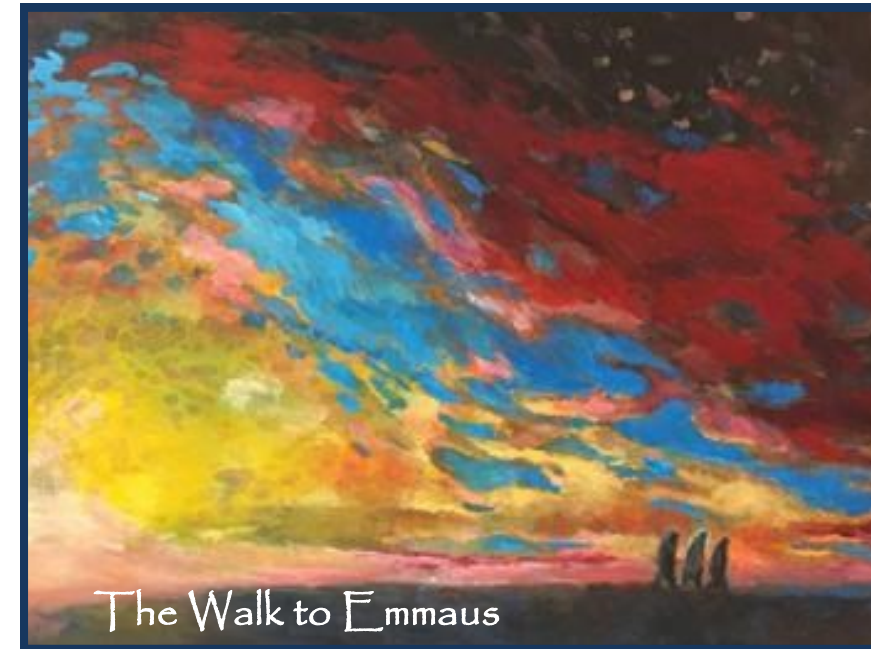

It is now located at One Church Street (former YMCA)

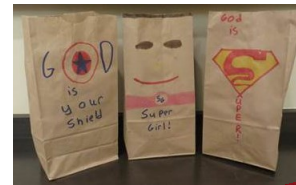
NOAH meals continue to be available **take out only**
