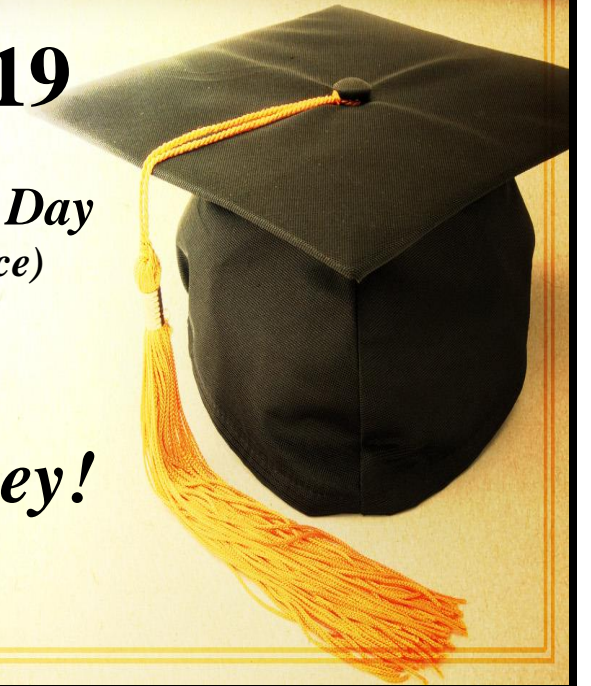

Family News & Concerns

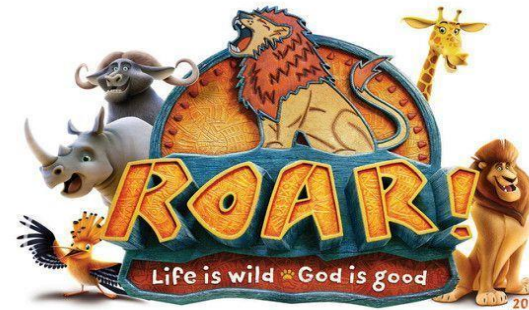
Steve Alsabrook is at home taking antibiotics. When the infection is gone and white blood count is down, they will schedule the mitral valve replacement heart surgery.
