

### A Note from the D'Altons

We first need to thank the Church of Christ in Haskell, Texas, for supporting us for the past two years. We know that you have accepted us as part of your spiritual family for much longer than that, but the last two years were a real blessing to be part of a Christian family, and the Haskell church has filled this need for us.

For those who have not followed our pilgrimage, here is a short explanation of where we are at present. We handed over the work in Tsumeb to the local folks there who are working under the auspices of Gospel Chariot Missions, a work initiated by George Funk. Our plans were to move to Rundu on the Angola border, but we ended up in Hentie's Bay, on the Atlantic coast.

Our first order of business was to become involved in the society here, and we approached the Frail Care Center, who immediately accepted our help and gave us membership to the Frail Care Association. The church in Walvis Bay came on our radar, and we offered our assistance to them, which they gladly accepted. This congregation is located just over 100 kilometers from where we live, so we can't be with them every Sunday, let alone Wednesdays for Bible Study. However, we have a standing arrangement to see them the first Sunday of every month.
