

“For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother.”

It must be hardwired in some of us human beings. We love to be exclusive! When we belong and others do not belong, it somehow appeals to our sense of self-respect and self-worth. It seems to declare, *“I may not be as important as they are, but I am more important than you are.”* I watched and laughed at an old Andy Griffith episode recently, Barney and Andy are invited to join an exclusive club located in the state capitol. Barney of course doesn't cut it but Andy does. What are Andy and Barney going to do?

Biblical Christianity differs from most other religions and most human organizations in the way it **includes** rather than **excludes**. It's focus is on serving rather than bragging. It focuses on giving everyone in Christ the same sense of worth, because those in Christ are members of God's family. **My approval means nothing. God's acceptance means everything.**

There was a time Christians in Corinth felt quite superior to other Christians for numbers of reasons. One of the numbers of ways Paul addressed the problem was by asking these questions: *“What do you have that you did not receive? But if you did receive it, why do you boast as if you had not received it?”* (1 Corinthians 4:7)

Does the Holy God provide us gifts through Jesus Christ? Does that include forgiveness? Redemption? Sanctification? Righteousness before God? Hope? If God gave it to us through Jesus Christ, why do we act like we are special instead of rightfully acting like God is special?

To whom does God make these incredible gifts available? Paul said of all and of himself: *“It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost of all.”* 1 Timothy 1:15 (NASB)

Nobody grants equal opportunity as good as God does. Everyone can be a part of God's family! Even Barney can.
