Following the drop off of mission project donations for Dallas Bethlehem Center and Wesley-Rankin Community Center, participants registered and enjoyed refreshments, welcomed old and new friends and listened to panelists on various subjects:

- Attendees gathered in Coleman Family Hall for lunch and the business meeting.
- At 11:52am, Julie Noel, North Texas Conference United Methodist Women President, called the business meeting to order. Barbara Weaver, Vice President of Metro District United Methodist Women, offered greetings from the Metro District United Methodist Women Mission Team. Marsha Mayo, President of the United Methodist Women of First United Methodist Church of Richardson welcomed attendees and thanked church staff, her local unit members, and Pam Shamblin, on-sight event coordinator.
- Greta McKelvey, NTC UMW Vice President, led the reading of the Purpose of United Methodist Women. She presented the annual meeting theme, "Called by Faith to transform the World".
- Julie Noel recognized people in the following categories by name or group:

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MINUTES (2/4)

- Minutes of the North Texas Conference United Methodist Women 45th Annual Meeting and Celebration in 2018 were printed in the 46th Annual Meeting Program Booklet. Becky Kegans moved to approve the minutes. Dr. Thalia Matherson seconded the motion, and voting delegates approved the minutes.
- Jane Morris, Acting Secretary and Joyce Whiteley, Mission Coordinator for Membership Nurture and Outreach, conducted the roll call and membership report
 - East District UMW
 - 24 total attendees (12 voting delegates)
 - 24 units – 477 total members
 - Metro District UMW
 - 110 total attendees (41 voting delegates)
 - 39 units – 2,440 total members
 - North Central District UMW
 - 23 total attendees (21 voting delegates)
 - 21 units – 1,138 total members
 - Northwest District UMW
 - 5 total attendees (5 voting delegates)
 - 20 units – 394 total members
- Joyce Whiteley stated that the United Methodist Women 2018 Census revealed a need for more technical help, that the preferred deadline for the 2019 Census was January 15, that local units could contact district mission coordinators for membership, nurture and outreach or her for help, and that numbers reported to districts in August of 2019 should be reported on the 2019 census form. A brief video with UMW General Secretary Harriett Jane Olson was shown. Joyce announced that she would take orders for UMW shirts at \$30.00 per shirt.
- Lela M. Luxen, NTC UMW Treasurer, began her report with an eight minute video about National UMW Mission Giving, the source of funds for national mission institutions, international ministries, regional missionaries, grants, and service and advocacy projects. Lela reviewed the 2018 budget ending December 31, 2018 and reported expenditures of \$110,266.00 for Pledge to Mission, \$24,942.00 for Administration and Membership Development, \$22,929.00 for Supplementary Gifts (designated), plus \$7,269.00 in love offerings for Hurricane Relief: UMW Project #3019250. She then went over 2019 budget expenditures as of August 31, 2019, which included \$67,073.00 for Pledge to Mission, \$17,189.00 for Administration and Membership Development, and \$8,766.00 for Supplementary Gift.
- District UMW officers presented their proposed budget amounts for 2020 Mission Giving:
 - East District UMW Treasurer Alicia Spears - \$20,000.00
 - Metro District UMW Treasurer Tommie Jenkins-Shed - \$75,000
 - North Central District UMW President Connie Calhoun-Amox - \$18,000.00
 - Northwest District UMW Treasurer Virginia Bovee - \$8,000.00
- Lela Luxen then presented the proposed North Texas Conference UMW 2020 budget, which included \$90,750.00 for Mission Giving and \$30,250.00 for Administration and Membership Development for a total budget of \$121,000.00. Lela noted that amounts for Mission Giving and Administration and Membership Development were both lower than the 2019 budgeted amounts because of lower receipts in the past year. The 2020 budget included line items for scholarships for conference-wide events. Beverly Funk, NTC UMW Communications Committee member for registrations, inquired why the budget included scholarships for the annual meeting. Julie Noel answered, “lunches”. Wendy Campbell, Chairperson of the NTC UMW Standing Rules Committee, added that providing lunches for newcomers and guests was a way of welcoming them. Andrea Hills, member of the First UMC of Richardson UMW asked for more explanation of why 2020 budget amounts were lower than 2019 budget amounts. Lela replied that income during the first two quarters of 2019 was down from income for the same periods in 2018. Both Lela and Julie emphasized that the

conference team wanted to be fiscally responsible. Dr. Thalia Matherson moved to approve the 2020 budget, Cynthia Harry seconded the motion, and delegates approved the 2020 budget. Lela prayed.

- Peggy Land and Jane Morris, Co-Mission Coordinators for Education and Interpretation thanked local UMW unit members for donating after school snacks for Dallas Bethlehem Center and snacks and first aid supplies for Wesley-Rankin Community Center. Peggy, the 2019 Mission u Assistant Dean who will serve as 2020 Dean, spoke about Mission u 2020 which will be held on July 23, 24, 25 and have a new format. She encouraged each local unit to provide a scholarship for a first-time attendee.
- As chairperson of the Standing Rules Committee, Wendy Campbell talked about proposed changes to the NTC UMW Standing Rules.

NTC UMW 2020 Annual Mission Project: Golden Cross Baby Shower

The North Texas Conference (NTC) UMW Annual Mission Project for 2020 was to collect baby items for the Methodist Dallas Medical Center's Golden Cross Academic Clinic's "Life Shines Bright Pregnancy Program." The program works to reduce the risk of preterm birth and features an innovative prenatal care program and group education for women and their partners.

By attending the "Life Shines Bright Pregnancy Program" classes, young parents earn "Mommie Bucks" to shop for baby items at the program center's store. The program needs many items, but this year's NTC UMW's mission project concentrated on requesting donations of the four most requested items which included: onesies, infant clothing 0-3 mo. and 3-6 mo. (particularly boy or neutral gender), diapers, and diaper wipes. Individuals and/or local UMW units from the four NTC UMW districts were asked to collect items and/or make donations to the project. Donated items were either mailed, hand-delivered, or sent through the Amazon.com Baby Registry to the Golden Cross Academic Clinic's "Life Shines Bright Pregnancy Program."

September 2020 Update: The Golden Cross Academic Clinic is setting aside all items being received in anticipation for the return of the "Mommie Bucks" program when it is safe for young parents and staff to return to parenting classes. According to Sonni Fiegel, RN, MBA, Director of Patient Care for Methodist Health System, "the staff is very excited to receive the packages [of donated items], and we are taking pictures and keeping lists of all who donate. [These donations are] ... boosting our supply and ... our morale." We started off 2020 at a fast pace!

In January, Ruth Bowen attended the Texas Legislative Event (TLE). The TLE was a fascinating and informative event attended by about 200 United Methodist Women from across Texas. Of the many very good speakers, the most dynamic was Colette Pinchon Battle, the Executive Director of the Gulf Coast Center for Law & Policy (GCCLP) in Louisiana. This group works on issues of global migration, community economic development, climate justice and equitable disaster recovery. Ms. Battle made an outstanding presentation describing the intersectionality of racism and climate change.

As part of the TLE, Ruth Bowen and Cynthia Rives visited with an aide to Rep. Lynn Stuckey to present the UMW's legislative priorities for 2020. In February, Ruth Bowen had a follow-up visit with Rep. Stuckey in his district office in Denton.

Katie Pryor was one of the key facilitators at the successful February 22 NTC UMW Racial Justice Event in Rowlett, and Ruth Bowen served as one of the table leaders. About 160 women attended, and a few men also participated. In May, Katie Pryor and Ruth Bowen initiated a UMW Bridge Course for the North Texas Conference based on the book *So You Want to Talk About Race* by Ijeoma Oluo. Katie Pryor was the moderator for a ZOOM group discussion about this book and the course in July, and 25 of the 43 registered for the course participated. In early August, nine additional persons registered for the UMW Bridge Course, bringing the total number of registrants to 52.

Katie Pryor was scheduled to attend the SCJ 2020 Quadrennial Meeting, but it was cancelled due to COVID-19.

Throughout the year, Ruth Bowen sends UMW Social Action information to each of the four District NTC UMW Social Action Coordinators as well as the District NTC UMW Presidents. UMW Social Action information is also featured in the weekly NTC UMW eblasts. Ruth Bowen and Katie Pryor are members of a Facebook group for UMW Social Action Coordinators.

Racism: An Individual, Interpersonal, Institutional, and Cultural Issue

What is racism? Racism is the use of power for maintaining privilege and systematic discrimination through institutions and structures in order: to deny access to education, employment, housing, social services, and other rights and benefits of society by law or by custom; and to perpetuate, solidify, and guarantee the economic, political, and social power of one group over other groups. Racism can be easy to see or hidden, intentional or unintentional. Its impact is measured by its effects, not by personal motivations.



Charter for Racial Justice

The United States—a nation of many peoples of different races, nationalities, languages and cultures—is challenged to make the Charter for Racial Justice a charter for everyone.

The Charter for Racial Justice was created and adopted by the Women's Division of the United Methodist General Board of Global Ministries in 1978. In 1980 the division successfully recommended adoption of the charter by the whole denomination. General Conference has consecutively readopted it, every eight years since, most recently in 2008. The charter continues United Methodist Women's urgent call for study and action on the principles and goals of its vision.

Living the Charter

Racial justice is a biblical issue

Read Exodus 1:8-14. How were the Egyptians and the Israelites each “raced”? Who are the “Egyptians” and who are the “Israelites” in the United States today?

Racial justice is a leadership issue

Who are the leaders in United Methodist Women? When and how are leadership and power shared across lines of race, ethnicity, language and class? Make institutional changes that build relationships of mutuality rather than charity.

Racial justice is a community issue

Assess changes in your community, state and nation. Where are racial/ethnic tensions arising? Make standing up for racial justice a regular part of your spiritual practice.

Racial justice is a public policy issue

Learn about laws that limit the rights of immigrants, racial/ethnic minorities and the poor to public education, social services and jobs. Join with others to exercise your political power to ensure equal and basic rights for all.





Charter for Racial Justice

in an Interdependent Global Community

Adopted by the 1980 General Conference of
The United Methodist Church

Because we believe

1. That God is the Creator of all people, and all are God's children in one family;
2. That racism is a rejection of the teachings of Jesus Christ;
3. That racism denies the redemption and reconciliation of Jesus Christ;
4. That racism robs all human beings of their wholeness and is used as a justification for social, economic, environmental and political exploitation;
5. That we must declare before God and before one another that we have sinned against our sister and brothers of other races in thought, in word and in deed;
6. That in our common humanity in creation, all women and men are made in God's image, and all persons are equally valuable in the sight of God;
7. That our strength lies in our racial and cultural diversity and that we must work toward a world in which each person's value is respected and nurtured;
8. That our struggle for justice must be based on new attitudes, new understandings and new relationships, and must be reflected in the laws, policies, structures and practices of both church and state;

We commit ourselves as individuals and as a community to follow Jesus Christ in word and in deed, and to struggle for the rights and the self-determination of every person and group of persons.

Therefore,

as United Methodists in every place across the land, we will unite our efforts
within the church to take the following actions:

1. Eliminate all forms of institutional racism in the total ministry of the church, giving special attention to those institutions that we support, beginning with their employment policies, purchasing practices, environmental policies and availability of services and facilities.
2. Create opportunities in local churches to deal honestly with the existing racist attitudes and social distance between members, deepening the Christian commitment to be the church where all racial groups and economic classes come together.
3. Increase efforts to recruit people of all races into the membership of The United Methodist Church and provide leadership development opportunities without discrimination.
4. Establish workshops and seminars in local churches to study, understand and appreciate the historical and cultural contributions of each race to the church and community.
5. Raise local churches' awareness of the continuing needs for equal education, housing, employment, medical care and environmental justice for all members of the community, and to create opportunities to work for these things across racial lines.
6. Work for the development and implementation of national and international policies to protect the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights of all people such as through support of the ratification of United Nations covenants on human rights.
7. Support and participate in the worldwide struggle for liberation in church and community.
8. Facilitate nomination and election processes that include all racial groups by employing a system that prioritizes leadership opportunities of people from communities that are disproportionately impacted by the ongoing legacy of racial injustice, and use measures to align our vision for racial justice with actions that accelerate racial equality.

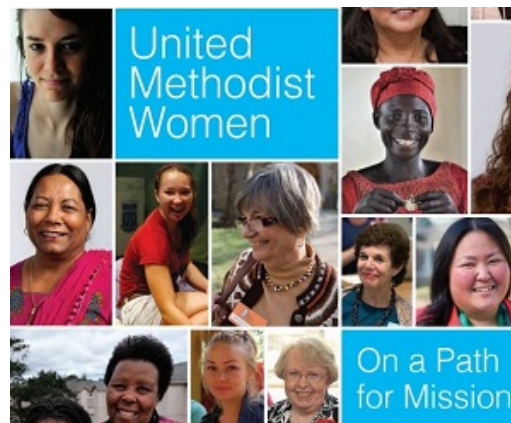

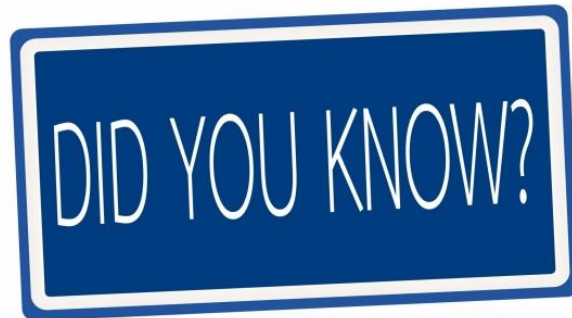

Beverly Jane Funk (1952-2020) spent her life in service to others. A teacher of children, leader of women, and a devoted disciple of Jesus Christ, Beverly left an indelible mark everywhere she went.

Born and raised in Maryland and a graduate of the University of Maryland with a major in elementary education, Beverly began her career as a teaching assistant in Montgomery County, Maryland. In 1975 she took a teaching position with Dallas ISD, where she worked for 33 years. Even after retirement from Dallas ISD, Beverly continued to be dedicated to children and their education, putting in many volunteer hours with Project Transformation (she also served as a board member for Project Transformation) as well as volunteering at the J. J. Rhoades Learning Center where she developed the volunteer tutoring program, the teacher appreciation program, and student attendance program.

Beverly joined First UMC Dallas in the 1980s, and she was a member of the Covenant Class as well as being active in numerous projects and outreach programs. Beverly was a driving force for all things United Methodist Women: she served as president (twice) of the First UMC-Dallas local UMW unit, served multiple times as the Circle leader for that unit's Ruth Circle, was a strong proponent of Texas Impact's UMW annual weekend legislative events (Texas Legislative Event), and was always among the first to encourage UMW members to attend National UMW's Assembly event.

Beverly's UMW leadership experience was not limited to the local level. She served as president for Dallas South NTC UMW (now known as the Metro District NTC UMW), as secretary and assistant Mission u dean in 2015, stepped up to serve as Mission u dean in 2016-2017, and served most recently (2018-2019) as a valuable member of the NTC UMW communications team in the role of NTC UMW event registrar.

Beverly battled to the end against the cancer that took her from this earthly life. Kind, loyal, generous, strong, outspoken, enthusiastic, funny – filled with love for God, family, and friends – she is gone too soon, but certainly not forgotten. She will be remembered by all who had the good fortune to call her friend.
