journal it!


Imagine you were one of the people in Jericho and the army of Israel was marching towards you. Write a story about what it was like to be there. What did you see? What did you hear? What did you feel?

Pour your heart out to God in a written prayer. Ask Him for help with something.





BIBLE VERSE TIC-TAC-TOE


Set up: Create a tic-tac-toe board. You can use tape on the floor to create a large board for the group or a piece of paper and some markers for a smaller board. Print out the included “Xs and Os” or use paper to create “Xs and Os” for your group.


Directions: Read the Bible verse several times so everyone can begin to memorize it. Today’s Bible verse says:




Divide your group into two teams. Give one team the “X” papers and the other team the “O” papers. Decide which team will go first and choose someone to recite the verse. If it is recited successfully, allow that team to place an “X or O” on any open square. If they recite it unsuccessfully, they may not place their “X or O” on the board. Next, give the other team a turn. Continue playing until one team has filled three spaces in a row (horizontal, vertical, or diagonal) with an “X or O” or until every space on the board has been filled. Continue playing rounds until everyone has had a turn and can recite the memory verse.


Question: Tell us about a time you put your faith into action. What was that like? How did people react?

















