A Story from our Brother in Christ: Kurt Buck

Isn't it funny how some words in the English language just seem to carry a more force than others? The negative power of words like suicidal, seething, murderous, or volcanic is obvious. A person described with these words is in a bad way. Other words sound more benign...frustrated, disillusioned, or discouraged. But the cumulative effect of this mindset can be a heavy load.

In the beginning of "It's a Wonderful Life" Clarence the angel is told that George Bailey is discouraged. My first reaction used to be "so what?"

I used to say, "Buck up, buttercup!"

But discouragement has a sneaky way of taking over your attitude sometimes. George had been a good friend, husband, son, and father his whole life. And now, through an innocent mistake, his life would be in ruins. He had always done his best. He was an encourager. And now, through an innocent mistake, his life would be in ruins. In that moment, he wished he had never been born.

He was supernaturally given the chance to see what life would have been like without him. His absence left a gaping hole in Bedford Falls. At the end of the film, he comes to the realization "It's a Wonderful Life." The town rallies to his aid, and his discouragement disappears.

You can attribute this whole tale to Hollywood scripts, and Christmas sentimentalism.

I could easily pass it off as well. My name is Kurt, not George. I live on the West side, NOT Bedford Falls. There are not a great deal of similarities between the movie and my life.

There was, however, a time in my life that mirrors it very closely. When my job ended at age 58, I was discouraged. You prayed for me. My last week on that payroll, I had minor surgery. I was discouraged. You prayed for me.

I went to a three week Driving School to get my CDL. I had to retake the test and stayed another week. As I prayed for my third try, I was discouraged. You prayed for me.

I ground those gears and sweat bullets, but because of your prayers, I passed. I drove home on that Monday, and made it to church at 7:10 p.m. The congregation gave me a round of applause as I entered.

Your prayers were answered. My prayers were answered. My discouragement had lifted.

Life in Christ, with His people, sharing love and prayers, really is 'A Wonderful Life." I'll never forget it.


