Thoughts from Colleen Reinke on the WWW

The Wednesday evening discussion service, the World Wide Worship (WWW) programs, have been very successful in their first month. A thriving Atheist/Humanist community turned out over 30 people for the first service. At least a dozen attended the remaining three services in March (Eastern religions, the Big Three, and Earth-based religions). I was able to attend each service and found them to be very interesting. The small group discussion is quite stimulating as well, and I am so anxious to see where this path leads us.

Let me tell you a story from the "Judaism, Christianity, Islam" Wednesday:

A fellow on crutches arrived a little late, sat in the circle, and immediately challenged the facilitator on evolution. Ah...I was not surprised that someone with a literal interpretation of Biblical scripture might come to one of our groups. When the man joined the small group I was facilitating (we were discussing the creation story from Genesis, which is common to all three religions) we began by introducing ourselves and we started asking questions about literal versus figurative interpretations of the creation story. I made sure all views were accorded respect and it soon became apparent that everyone in the group believed we are to be stewards of the earth rather than dominators. We asked questions of each other; we shared our viewpoints. At one point, the fellow remarked that it was nice to be able to sit in a group of folks who disagreed, but could do so cordially with respect. Yep, I said, that is what these services are about.

Frankly, having this fellow with his traditional views in our group was wonderful. It was challenging. I learned a lot, and I think he did too. We laughed with each other and I hope he comes back.

This encounter has led me to think about how interesting it would be to engage with other churches, other people with other beliefs, in extended conversations about religion and what it means to be human. That deserves some additional thought...What do you think?
