Greetings from the Lighthouse!

This past month is always one of the most intensive of the semester for our students and our ministry. In October, we've been going constantly for 2 ½ months, we have midterm tests, Homecoming, change of weather, and the distant hope of the upcoming Thanksgiving Break. It can be tiresome to say the least. However, I want to brag a minute about our students and the churches that support us. Since our last newsletter, we've added 5 more people to our small groups and one-on-one discipleship. That may not seem like a lot, but we've jumped from 34 to 39. Lastly, we have 4 underclassman that are showing interest in being on leadership and are getting prepared for that step in the Spring. All I can say is that the fruit of the Gospel is ripening! Also, our associational churches have been amazing at serving our students on Mondays so that we can build relationships with new students and share the gospel with them. In fact, some families from our churches have adopted international students and are consistently having those students in their churches. And one of our church's members was able to share her testimony with 2 Indian students last week! So, looking back at the craziness of the semester, I wanted us to stop and see the wonderful work that God is doing through you and the Lighthouse as we strive together for the gospel! Thank you!
