

JACK FLEISCHER MEMORIAL FUND (JFMF)

GUIDELINES

Jack Fleischer was an energetic young man who loved to be involved in his church and community youth programs, including Home Works Mission Trips and Diocesan Retreats. He was active in his community as an Eagle Scout and cherished his group of friends from his high school, AC Flora. He also had a deep love for St. Christopher Camp & Conference Center where he was a camper, counselor, intern, and staff member.

The Jack Fleischer Memorial Fund (JFMF) is established by his family with the purpose of financially supporting the youth of St. John's and the community, so they may also experience the areas of Jack's life that he loved. It will be funded by initial contributions from Jack's family, friends, and fellow parishioners of St. John's.

1. Acceptance of Gifts. Gifts are to be made to St. John's Episcopal Church and designated for the Jack Fleischer Memorial Fund (JFMF). Gifts other than cash and marketable securities or gifts with stipulations or restrictions may only be accepted upon approval by the Vestry.
2. Designation of Memorial Gifts. The JFMF will be used to support the following activities:
 - a. Diocesan Events. All Diocesan youth retreats, gatherings and DYLC events will be free of charge for members of St. John's. No application necessary.
 - b. Home Works
 - a. Johns Island Mission Trip. The JFMF will contribute \$100 toward the registration cost for members of St. John's. No application necessary.
 - b. Service in the Soda City. The JFMF will donate \$1000 every year to offset the cost.
 - c. Community. The JFMF will support events, speakers and programs that promote community among the students at AC Flora High School. Applications are to be submitted to the JFMF Board for approval.
 - d. Faith Formation Experiences. The JFMF will support summer camps such as St. Christopher Camp & Conference Center and Bishop Gravatt Camp and Conference Center and mission trips for youth members of St. John's that teach, inspire and train our youth in their Christian walk. Applications are to be submitted to the JFMF Board for approval.

Upon a decision by the Board of the contributions and grants to be made from the JFMF, the Rector (in the absence of a Rector, Priest in Charge or Senior Warden) shall authorize the St. John's Treasurer to remit the funds as so designated by the Board.

3. JFMF Board. The JFMF Board shall monitor funds of JFMF, will have the discretion by majority vote to award grants in the areas specified and shall maintain the objectives of the JFMF. The Board will consist of the following members: Family Member(s), Friend(s) of Jack, St. John's Rector (In the absence of a Rector, Priest in Charge or Senior Warden), St. John's Youth Minister (In the absence of a Youth Minister, a parent of a youth group member), St. John's Vestry Member (2-year term), St. John's Church Member(s) (2-year term) and Columbia community member(s) (2-year term).

4. Recognition of Gifts. St. John's shall acknowledge each donor and notify Jack's parents or other identified family member upon the receipt of gifts received.

5. Growth. It is agreed by all that the hope for this fund will be to grow financially and benefit the youth of St. John's and of the Columbia community.

The JFMF Guidelines may be updated and/or changed by the Board, with approval of the St. John's Vestry.
