Together in ministry this year:

Learning Together: Our Sunday School continues to support the foundation of our Christian faith thanks to teachers, volunteers, and children who see value in sharing their faith in the gospel of Christ. Together with the confirmation classes, we strive to affirm the promise spoken to us through our baptism. This year we have 23 active 7th and 8th Graders meeting on Wednesday nights, as well as, 12 9th Grade/Mentor pairs who are sharing their faith together. This is supported by you, the families, and non-related members of St. John. We offered a variety of adult educational opportunities from our study on the Book of Romans to our new weekly Daily Discipleship Bible Study on Wednesday mornings. Our Daily Discipleship Bible Study is a joy to me, because within it, we are gathered by the word of God, but also, connect in fellowship, join in care and prayer for the members of the congregation and community, and share faith in daily life. I look forward to more opportunities like this, so we have intentionally looked at ways to do this in the whole of the congregation through our First Sunday Forums where we talk about our ministry and offer opportunities for members to share and be heard.

Connecting Together: Whether it be making quilts, serving dinners, inviting a friend or family to join us for fellowship and worship, visiting over a cup of coffee with some treats, kicking off the program year on Rally Sunday, or weekly through our worship services, it is through these moments that we share life as the body of Christ here in this place.

Last year, I invited us to look ahead to three areas: stewardship, identity, and ministry together.

Stewardship

Our Stewardship Committee and our sub-committee of the Bell Tower Fundraising Committee were very active. We shared stories about what stewardship means, why we give, and the areas of ministry that we are active in now. We asked you to think or re-think your estimate of giving to the general budget and your pledge to the bell tower repair project. Now, we thank. Thank you to those who serve on these committees and you who gave to these two areas, as well as others (building fund, music fund, feed my sheep, etc.)! Thank you to those who share your time and talents here in many and various ways! Thank you, because we were able to:

meet our budget,

surpass \$100,000 in giving to the bell tower project

cover our past carry over short fall from the previous year.

Through stewardship revival within our congregation after several years of dormancy, we focused on the importance of fixing the bell tower and giving to the general budget which supports the day to day ministry of St. John. So many more exciting possibilities lay ahead for St. John Lutheran as we continue to share in stewardship of our congregation and community together!

A few were from new members, others were members who had been taken off our membership without transferring, but the largest amount were young adults (21-35) who were still listed under their parents.

All members – active, inactive, and affiliated – are members of this body of Christ. Finding ways to invite members to share their gifts and participate in the life of our congregation is what we are called to do. I am excited about the possibilities this brings for evangelism, as well as, stewardship. Because one cannot do evangelism without stewardship or stewardship without evangelism.

Ministry Together

Hearing the request for some more variety in the music used within our worship services, we are adding 200 more songs through Song Select for our use.

Over this past year, we've looked at our mission statement which is where our mission is centered on Christ and our invitation to share this through all of the facets of St. John.

Through Feed My Sheep and the support for the food shelf, to name just a few, we have helped with the immediate need of members of our congregation with food cards, gas cards, and financial support.

Through our \$5000 (2.7% of our budget) in mission support to the Southeastern Minnesota Synod, we support our campus ministries, partner congregations in other countries, Lutheran World Relief, and the support of those who are called as candidates for ordination into ministry.

So now, I am inviting you to look forward to the year ahead, there are three areas I would like to lift up:

Visioning, Engaging, Growing

St. John Lutheran Church Council Report for 2019

2019 was a very busy year for St. John Lutheran Church.

Late in the summer, Building Restoration Corporation began restoration work on our bell tower. As we fully expected, they found some structural issues that necessitated the temporary cessation of the ringing of the bell at the beginning of the church service. We were able to contract with Met-Con Companies, out of Faribault, to address these structural issues. As of the weekend of January 11th and 12th, we are, once again, able to ring the bell. We have also contacted Building Restoration Corporation to verify that we are on their calendar for them to complete their work in the Spring.

We are continuing to implement the recommendations that were made by the Audit Committee.

Missy continues to grow in her position in the church office.

We have begun a monthly First Sunday Forum, held during Fellowship Hour, to address the ministries of St. John Lutheran Church and any concerns the Council or individual congregation members may have. This has been very well received by the congregation. We have found that communication is key to the growth of our Church family.

The Stewardship Committee has been reorganized and has very active members.

We continue to support Pastor Jason as he implements his new and exciting ministries. He has begun a weekly Wednesday morning Bible study, which is well-attended, even in Pastor Jason's absence.

During 2020, we look forward to the following: Finish the work on the bell tower!

Begin work to repair water damage in the Sanctuary.

Continue to support Pastor Jason in his ministry.

Have a balanced budget at the end of 2020.

Prepare for an audit by the Audit Committee.

Preschool through 4th grade classes have started using the SPARK curriculum and it's been well received. 5th and 6th grades continue to use CONNECT. Curriculum costs may be slightly elevated over the next couple years as we acquire the necessary teacher guides, however, we've made efforts to minimize costs by not purchasing the optional DVDs, additional teacher guides, etc.

September 2019: Rally Sunday was a great success! As in past years, Sunday School registration took place after the outdoor service/live music. Following registration, all teachers attended mandatory annual training.

December 2019: The Christmas program was held December 15th. A new, slightly-more-contemporary play was used and the kids really enjoyed it. All Sunday school age groups participated (approximately 70 students) and a number of students provided prelude music. Thank you to Emily Hoefs, Erin Krautkremer, Kathy Heyda, Hailey Kadrlik, and all the Sunday School teachers for making the program a success!

Goals for 2020: To continuing providing the teachers with the support and resources they need. Teachers have requested updated storage cabinets (the current cabinets are outdated and falling apart) and whiteboards (some of them show significant signs of use and are difficult to utilize and clean) and we're looking into some cost-effective options to meet these needs.

St. John is so fortunate to have so many people willing to dedicate their time and talent to make the youth programs and activities at St. John so successful. Thank you to ALL who've contributed in so many ways – your kindness is appreciated!

Fundraising

We offer a variety of fundraising events to help keep costs of events low. Fundraisers this year included the Valentines Spaghetti Dinner, Pancake Breakfast, Spring flower sale, Flamingo Flocking, Puffin's sale, Butter Braid sale, July Kolacky Day pageant concessions, cleaning the Pioneer Power Threshers kitchen in April and August, the Poinsettia and Easter lily sale. We have an ongoing European Roasterie Coffee fundraiser.

We created a family account system to allow families to fundraise in advance for our activities. We are hoping this enables families to offset the cost of our more expensive activities such as the Mission trips.

We started a Script fundraising program this fall. This program gives a percentage of the cost of a prepaid gift card back to St John. This fundraiser can be used to fund family accounts or be directed to the Church General Fund or the Bell Tower Fund.

We also started partnering with Adam Sery and his Hands of the Kingdom non profit organization. Through this organization we can work at venues such as Target Field, Allianz stadium and US Bank stadium for various events. Funds made at these events can be directed to a family account or the Bell Tower Fund.

It was a fun and productive year for the Luther League Committee and we look forward to the new year and all the opportunities it will bring to attain our mission:

2019 Women of the Church Annual Report

In 2019 a total of 96 quilts were donated to Lutheran World Relief, with a few given to the Peace Center in New Prague. Six of the 96 quilts were donated for the Bell Tower Fund. In addition, there were 53 quilts made outside of the quilting workdays and of those 45 were sent to Alaska with the remaining given to Ruth's House and Lutheran Social Services.

We also shipped off 81 layettes, 47 school kits, 61 personal care kits to Lutheran World Relief and 31 layettes to Liberia.

Thank you to all who headed up the various projects and to all the workers. A big Thank You to the men who head the funeral committee.

Endowment Fund Report 2019 St. John Lutheran Church

The Endowment Fund invests permanent funds that have been donated to the church. The interest is only used for the purpose specified by the donor. If no specific purpose was designated, the Council makes a determination as to the use of the interest, Historically, earnings have been used to support youth activities and a youth director. Other existing funds are the World Mission Fund (which contributed to the recent Alaskan Mission Trip) and a Catastrophic Illness Fund.

Ralph Hendrickson, a longtime chairman of the group, resigned in late 2018 due to health concerns. His steadfast dedication and stewardship to the committee for decades was commendable. The open position was filled by Marc Peterson. With reorganization, Mark Brahs became the chairman, and Dan Hardel continues as secretary, treasurer. Members of the committee are; Glen Kerkow, Charles Richter, Jim Blum, Marvin Jakes Sr. and Troy Domine. The committee invests funds in financial vehicles that have little risk of loss of principal, mainly FDIC insured Certificates of Deposit in area banks, ELCA Mission Accounts, as well as some Annuities. The current low interest rate environment presents challenges to the committee as it seeks to attain returns that meet financial expectations. Following is a breakdown of the fund:

2019 SOUTHEASTERN MINNESOTA SYNOD MINISTRY REPORT

In the first few months as your bishop, two priorities have emerged:

To develop and deepen relationships with congregations and leaders.

To evaluate and adjust administrative processes as necessary.

The first sparked a new two-pronged initiative called Ministry Together.

The first prong includes intentional meetings with pastors and deacons on three days each month, providing one-on-one conversation and prayer.

The second prong is all about our presence in congregations. I and the synod staff have already been present with over 85 congregations since my term began in September. This intentionality will continue throughout the new year.

As I meet with leaders and visit congregations, there are three main questions our discussion revolves around:

What is going well?
 What are your challenges?
 How can the synod staff support you?

These mutual questions are paving the way for discerning together what new places the Spirit is inviting us into and how to best live into our identity as the People of God in this time and place. We will explore this in depth at our Synod Assembly in May as we gather around the theme *Poured Out* based on *Joel 2:28-29:*

"I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. Even on the male and female slaves, in those days, I will pour out my spirit."

In 2020, we will continue our focus to develop and deepen relationships and refine our administrative processes to best support our ministry together.
