This quote comes from the book, <u>A Grief Observed</u> written by C.S. Lewis about his experiences after the death of his wife. When you have lost a loved one it is oftentimes hard to understand what you are feeling and if those feelings are normal.

We just finished a six-week fall grief support group at the church. Grief support groups are one of the best helping resources for those who have lost a loved one thru death. A participant shared that attending "helped them in not feeling alone and feeling comforted from others in the group". They also learn that while their own grief is unique they can experience similarities and understand they are not alone in their feelings. Also, to be patient and compassionate with themselves and feel what they feel - no one can tell them how they should be feeling as they are the expert in their own grief.

A grief support group will be offered again in the spring so watch your newsletter for dates closer to that time. If you have any questions please contact me or the church.


