This revelation that we have received through the continued sharing of the gospel of Jesus Christ is the very thing that makes us who we are. We are called and gathered by the Holy Spirit into this body of Christ. This should be music to our ears and our thankfulness for God's grace should continue to pour forth from us.

The hymn, "I Love to Tell the Story," does a wonderful job of reminding us of the power and importance of this word, especially the 3 verse.
