Faith Active through Love - Worship

As children of God, we are a family **living out the Gospel** of **Jesus Christ through** worship, fellowship, and service.

As we continue to walk through the Mission Statement of St. John Lutheran, this month we move forward to "living out the Gospel of Jesus Christ through worship." Each time we gather to worship, we are invited into God's rest, (His Sabbath), to hear of the work of what He has done for our sake through the sending of His Son, in Jesus death and resurrection, we are saved and redeemed by God's grace and love, not through any work of our own. We are gathered. We sing songs telling of God's grace and work. We confess our sin. We hear of His forgiveness through absolution. We hear of His deeds through scripture read. We hear the word preached. We lift up prayers which our Father promises to hear. We receive life and forgiveness through Holy Communion. We are sent out to share this good news, the gospel of Christ, to those who need to hear this word, this life, this invitation to come.

In Luther's Small Catechism, we ponder and struggle with Martin Luther's explanation of the 3rd Commandment, "We are to fear and love God, so that we do not despise preaching or God's word, but instead keep that word holy and gladly hear and learn it."

In worship, we are invited into a Physical and Spiritual time of celebration and rest; Physical celebrating and resting: "We stop our handiwork and our labor in order to assemble in church, be present at Mass (Holy Communion), listen to God's word, and pray in union with others (Treatise on Good Works, p79)."

Spiritual celebration: "This entails not only laying down our work, but also letting God alone work in us without applying any power of our own...Humankind, damaged by sin, has an inordinate love and predilection for all things sinful...in all that we do or leave undone, we seek our own will, advantage, and honor more than that of God and our neighbors. All our works, words, and thoughts even our entire lives, are baleful and not godly. If God is to work and live in us, all those vices and corruption must be choked back and extirpated – placing all our works, words, thoughts, and lives on hold, so that... "not we, but Christ may live, be active, and speak in us (Treatise on Good Works, p 80)."

It is in this that we are invited into good works, not those of our flesh, but works that come to us in an alien way in our faith active through love. "The first work, faith, is to have a good heart and trust in God, which springs forth the second good work, praising God's name, acknowledging God's grace, and giving honor to God. After that comes the third work: worshiping by praying, attending to the sermon, and meditating on God's blessing castigating (rebuking) and subjugating (overpowering) the flesh (Treatise on Good Works, pp. 87-88)."

Here at St. John, may you be gathered, find your rest, receive His promise, and be sent out, living the Gospel through worship in Jesus name.

Worship & Music Notes for September

We have been singing new music from SongSelect since the beginning of May. We hope you have enjoyed the new music and the powerful words in the lyrics. The more you sing this music, the more you will fix them in your minds and hearts. Generations have argued (and will continue to do so) about what is "good music". If music isn't presented in the style and sound which we have grown comfortable with over the years, we do not know what to think of it and may be scared to accept it. However, we may hear His voice when we stop a moment to consider the substance of what is being presented.



Rally Day is Sunday, September 8, 2019. On that day, we will have an outdoor service in the backyard. We will sing some classic Sunday School songs that kids of all ages love to sing. Bring your lawn chairs. This is the day we kick-off our school year and install our Sunday School teachers. A church potluck will follow the outdoor service. Choir rehearsals begin in September. Mark your calendars!

- **Sunday School children** rehearse their songs during Sunday School opening. The children will sing during the church service on October 13th, December 15th, December 24th (3:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service), February 9th, March 15th and April 5th.
- **Rock'n the Church Choir** will start rehearsals on Sunday, September 15. This choir is open to children in grade 3 through grade 6. We practice after Sunday School from 11:00 11:30 AM in the church sanctuary. Rock'n the Church will sing during the church service on October 20th, November 17th, December 15th, December 24th (5:00 PM Christmas Eve service), February 16th, March 22nd, April 19th and May 3rd.
- **Bells of St. John** will start rehearsals on Wednesday, September 11 at 7:00 PM. We usually ring the last Sunday of the month.
- **The Voices of St. John** will sing for Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve and Easter Sunday services. They will rehearse Wednesday nights before each of these services. For the Thanksgiving Service rehearsals are October 30th, November 6th, November 13th and November 20th. For the 10:00 PM. Christmas Eve Service rehearsals are December 4th, December 11th and December 18th. For Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020 rehearsals are March 4th, March 18th, April 1st and April 8th.
