#### What is the Gospel that we live out?

As children of God, we are a family **living out the Gospel of Jesus Christ** through worship, fellowship, and service.

I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel-not that there is another gospel, but there are some who are confusing you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ. Galatians 1:6-7

Continuing to walk through the Mission Statement of St. John Lutheran, this month we move forward to "living out the Gospel of Jesus Christ." Before we move to the various ways that we live out this gospel over the next few months, we must clarify, "What is the gospel of Christ?"

The gospel of Christ is that very thing through which the Holy Spirit has called us. The gospel of Christ is the very thing through which we have come to believe. As we enter into this time of Pentecost, Holy Trinity Sunday, and the Season after Pentecost, we turn once again to the Apostles' Creed; specifically, in the living out of the Gospel of Christ, we must first turn to how it is we are called, empowered, and kept. The explanation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Article of the Apostles' Creed centers us and sends us out:

I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins – mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true.

This isn't just any old gospel, this isn't just a way of salvation, but it **is** our salvation – the gospel of Christ that has been revealed to us and the very gospel which has claimed us.

But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood,
will we be saved through him from the wrath of God.

For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son,
much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life.
But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ,
through whom we have now received reconciliation. Romans 5:8-11

It is out of this identity that we have been given and this grace poured out upon us that we live. In our daily lives, we do this through the words we use, the vocations (daily work) we are called into, and this grace that we have been sent out to share in Christ's name.

## **Worship & Music Notes for Summer**

Worship is a powerful way for us to remember what God has done for us. When we worship, we increasingly know the Lord more.

On June 2<sup>nd</sup>, we will change liturgy for our worship services to Setting Three. This is a familiar setting that was used in the Lutheran Book of Worship (green) hymnal. After the Confession and Forgiveness on page 94-95 and after the Gathering Song we will continue the service on page 138 with the Kyrie and the Canticle of Praise ("Glory to

God" or "This is the feast"). The Gospel Acclamation is on page 142 and the Great Thanksgiving is on page 144. Our Offertory hymn will change to "Give Thanks".

The Day of Pentecost is June 9<sup>th</sup>. Pentecost is a day of promises fulfilled. The promised Spirit of God is poured out. The baptized have become "children of God" and "joint heirs with Christ". By the power of the Spirit we have seen the face of the Father in his only begotten Son and been saved by him. Members of the congregation are encouraged to wear red on June 8/June 9 when we celebrate Pentecost. Along with Christmas and Easter, Pentecost is one of the three most important and celebratory days of the church year. On the fiftieth day of Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as the power of God among us. In the reading from Acts, images of wind and fire describe the Spirit poured out on disciples of all nations. Think fire, think God. Therefore, red is the energetic color for this day.

Trinity Sunday is June 16<sup>th</sup>. On this day we celebrate the name of God. There is no other day quite like this one in the church's year. The opening Confession and Forgiveness begins in the name of the Trinity. The greeting with which we begin the liturgy each week proclaims the Trinity. Each week we recite the Creed in which we profess our belief in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Our worship concludes with a Trinitarian blessing.......Praise Father, Son and Holy Spirit! Special music during the Sunday service will include a piano/organ duet entitled "Holy, Holy, Holy".

# Newly Elected Bishop of the SE MN Synod

Rev. Regina Hassanally was elected June 1<sup>st</sup> to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, held May 31<sup>st</sup> - June 1<sup>st</sup> in Rochester, MN. Hassanally was elected on the fifth ballot, with 237 votes. She currently serves as pastor of St. Luke's Lutheran
