



MISSION OF THE MONTH

Red Legacy Recovery

Red Legacy Recovery's mission is to empower women in East TN with the skills they need to begin a new life in recovery from drug & alcohol addiction. They strive to equip each woman with the tools to be self-sufficient, self-confident & employed. Inspire change. Cultivate strength.

Red Legacy Recovery (RLR) has been serving all women offenders serving time at the Carter County Detention Center in Elizabethton, TN, since October 1, 2012. 95% of the inmates RLR serve admit to being an addict or alcoholic.

Red Legacy conducts life-skills training with approximately 60-80 offenders per session in bi-monthly classroom style workshops inside the jail. These RLR workshops include self-confidence/self-esteem, money management/household budgeting, job search/resume writing, dressing for success, job interview training, parenting skills, vision casting/goal setting, journal/creative writing, substance abuse recovery plan and release plan from jail. These workshops provide the necessary skills for these offenders to be able to not only gain self-confidence and self-esteem, but also prepare them for life outside of jail. Because of the skill sets taught at these workshops, these inmates are more likely to stay clean and sober and search for and obtain employment, saving the taxpayers' \$45-\$60 a day – the approximate cost to keep an inmate incarcerated. In addition, the children of these offenders will be forever impacted in a positive way due to the fact that their parent has a new outlook on life, a support system, and additional skills that will enable her to be a productive part of the community and household. Currently, 25% of RLR's time and resources are allocated to this program. RLR began providing public workshops in December of 2012. These "Public Workshops" are open to any woman in the community who is in recovery from drug and alcohol addiction, as well as our Red Legacy participants from the Carter County jail once they are released. RLR continues the same programs that are used inside the jail at these workshops. In addition, the 12-Step program is taught along with additional guest speakers included on occasion. Examples of guest speakers include representatives from CHIPS Domestic Violence Center, Carter County Adult Education, Milligan College, East Tennessee State University, and various attorneys that come to help educate offenders on the meaning of the law as it pertains to their cases.
