That was when another seasoned soldier prayed, "O LORD, open his eyes and let him see!" The LORD opened the young man's eyes, and when he looked up, he saw that the hillside around Elisha was filled with horses and chariots of fire." (2 Kings 6:17).

July 4th is Independence Day. It is the day to thank God for blessing America, but to also pray and repent because we have wasted so many blessings in prodigal living. The wrong question is to ask if the Lord is on our side. The question that demands an answer is, "Who is on the Lord's side?"

Robin Folse, Administrative Assistant





TLC Community Center is a Christian Ministry located at 145 Judge Don Lewis Blvd, Elizabethton, TN, a familiar address to FUMC. Each month FUMC serves in the Food for the Multitude Program, a community meal ministry. The TLC Center provides their facility to Food for the Multitude. This is just one example of the generosity and love for the community that the TLC Community Center provides.

Founded originally in 1990 as Abortion Alternatives and Women's Center. The ministry focused on alternatives to abortion, pregnancy related services for women, men, and their families, and promoting abstinence as a safe healthy lifestyle for unmarried persons. The ministry flourished under the guidance and love of founder Angie Odom and soon grew into The TLC Community Center, which houses and provides a variety of services to their clients as well as their community through in house services and outreach programs and education in the schools.

FUMC is also familiar with another mission of TLC, The Summer Lunch Program. Yes, all those Monday Peanut butter Pal sandwiches are distributed by TLC. Throughout the summer with the help of local churches, businesses and volunteers, TLC distributes lunch to the children of the community.

Other TLC missions are: Mommy Mart, Soup Kitchen, Lending Libraries, and Bundle of Joy Program just to name a few.


