



# A Hand Up, Not a Hand Out

Holston Habitat for Humanity is part of a global, non-profit housing organization operated on Christian principles that seeks to put God's love into action by building homes, communities and hope. The affiliate's service area includes Sullivan, Washington, and Carter Counties in Tennessee, as well as the city of Bristol, Virginia.

Holston Habitat for Humanity seeks to share the love of Christ by creating partnerships with communities, families and volunteers to improve the quality of life for families in need by providing simple, affordable, and decent housing and opportunities for home ownership.

Each year churches of Holston Conference give loose change to benefit children's ministries in Holston Conference as well as United Methodist related ministries around the world. And every year, several groups receive this pocket change in the form of grants for programs that benefit children, such as those that provide food, daycare, and/or Bible studies.

To date we have collected \$144.60 through pocket change deposited in the boxes located throughout the church. We will collect this offering for the 2020 Holston Conference through June 20th.



# **Holston Conference Takes Up Fight Against Opioid Addiction**

Through a survey conducted in 2017 throughout Holston Conference, conference leaders were made aware that the number one social problem frequently expressed throughout East Tennessee, Southwest Virginia, and North Georgia is the impact of the opioid epidemic on communities. Tennessee, Virginia, and Georgia are in the top 10 states impacted by opioid overdose deaths. Tennessee is ranked first in the nation in opioid sales.

Given these findings, the June 2020 Holston Annual Conference missions offering will focus on opioid addiction. Monies donated by Conference churches will be used for grants to help churches begin new, or strengthen existing ministries that address the opioid crisis. Traditionally the annual conference missions offering garners more than \$100,000.


