


### Building a Bee Hive




### UPCOMING TUESDAY BIBLE STUDIES



Can you believe the kids are back in school and Autumn is around the corner. Time to add Bible Study to your Fall schedule. This year will be very different. We will be using one reference book for Fall, Winter, and summer. The overarching topic "Comparative Religion."

Beginning in the Fall with Eastern Belief systems (Hinduism, Buddhism, Taoism, Confucianism...); then after the holidays we will explore Western Traditions - or the 3 Abrahamic belief systems: Judaism, Islam and Christianity (including sects and cults: Mormonism, Jehovah's Witness, New Age, etc).

Why is it important to understand other faiths? Can you articulate your own worldview? What is the difference in your worldview and that of other beliefs? A generation ago most everyone we knew went to church. The question wasn't "if" you went to church, but rather "which one"? Today we live in a multicultural society and our lack of understanding of other faiths results in misunderstandings of actions of others, and is a hindrance to our ability to fulfill our "Great Commission", and also makes us ill-equipped to prepare our children and grandchildren to understand what they believe.







