Restroom Plans

At the August vestry meeting, Jack Fairbank and Laura McQuade, presented the projected budget, sample tiles, and pictures for rehabbing both restrooms at the back of the nave. Work will begin with the current Ladies Room. When completed both restrooms will be single occupancy bathrooms, as the two other church restrooms already are. Enhanced lighting, tile floors and walls, new fixtures including a vanity are all part of the project which is being done by parish volunteers.

The vestry approved an overall budget for the project of \$3000-\$5000. An anonymous donation of \$1000 towards the cost of the tile has already

been received. More donations are needed. The project cost estimate will be posted in case parishioners prefer donating an amount equal to the cost of specific items.

It is expected that the Ladies Room will be completed this Fall.

Commitment Campaign

Bob Conklin has scheduled the Commitment Campaign for the month of October beginning with the Warden's talk on October 1, and ending with the final collection of cards from all parishioners on October 29.
