



"We adore thee, O Christ, and we bless thee. Because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world."

These words often begin each reading / meditation for the Stations of the Cross, a common practice during Lent. The Stations of the Cross is a prayer walk (often inside a church), going from picture/cross to picture/cross (14 total) - each depicting/representing an event of Christ's final suffering (e.g. his condemnation, his carrying the cross, woman weeping for him, being nailed to the cross, etc.)

At each "station" a short Bible passage and prayer/meditation is read,; there are several variations. But each event remembered is the same - hearkening participants back to those gruesome final hours of Jesus's life. **For in remembering his suffering, we are put in mind of our need for repentance of our neglect, complacency, self-seeking, and pride—all of which Jesus bore for us on the cross.** In walking and remembering Jesus' final journey, we are also encouraged to see Christ in those suffering around us, that we would follow his example and sacrifice to help them.

Stations of the Cross is a devotional exercise that can be done individually or in a group and it originates from the practice of early Christian pilgrims who visited Jerusalem and walked the traditional route from the supposed location of Pilate's house to Calvary. **You are invited to participate in this tradition of "following Jesus" on Wednesday April 17th at 7:00 pm.** You'll find the "stations" on the right side wall of the sanctuary. Or if you'd like to walk the "Stations of the Cross" for yourself sometime, see Fr. Steven after the Sunday service.

"We was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief. Like one from whom men hide their faces. He was despised, and we esteemed Him not. Surely He took on our infirmities and carried our sorrows." (Isaiah 53: 3-4a)
