JOIN THE TRIUMPH

"May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." ~ Romans 15:5-7

Worship. A powerful two-syllable word in our English language derived from an Old English word, worthscipeor "worthship". The two roots, worth and ship, tell us a lot about what worthship is. "Worth" refers to worthiness, giving worth to something and "ship" means "to shape." Essentially, our worship shapes us by what we attribute worth to be. If we worship money and material possessions, then we will be shaped by those things. If we worship our career, our career in turn becomes a defining factor in our lives. The same is true of God. As

we worship God, God can (and does) shape us.

In Hebrew, the seven most common words used to describe worship include, barak (kneel/bow), halal (praising with your lips), shachah (fall down flat), tehillah (sing a new song), todah (thanksgiving), yadah (extend/hold out the hand), and zamar (touching the strings or parts of a musical instrument). Every single one of these words has a very physical, very active meaning. There is no "state of being" in this definition, but a very real description of the ways in which we

are to act toward God. These words infer movement, action, interaction, and relationship. God used the greatest songwriter in all history, David, to write 150 of the greatest songs which are found in the book of Psalms. He instructs us to "enter His gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to Him; bless His name!" (Psalm 100:4). Psalm 95 says, "Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise. As believers in
