## Pastoral Letter

Advent, the season leading up to Christmas, is my favorite liturgical season. It seems this time every year I find myself in a place of muttering to God, "Well God, have you seen all this? The world's a total mess. It's so dark and painful."

And 2020 blows the pants off of all previous years.

I saw an ornament that had "2020" on a literal dumpster fire, and it seems to encapsulate our collective experience perfectly.

It's to these moments that Advent speaks so well. Because it's in this season that we express our hurts at the state of our world, as well as our longing for Jesus, and prepare for Jesus while we wait. We await the birth of the Christ child, we welcome Christ into our hearts in the here and now, and we await when Christ comes again in final victory. Advent resonates because we can express how hopeless the world feels.

And scripture reminds us that we do have hope. The hope of the world is Christ.

Now I love the other markers of the usual Christmas season too: trees, decorations, lights, movies, and gifts. But this year I just don't seem to have the same cheer. Or it rings just a little hollow for me. Then I read Scott Erickson's Honest Advent, and it hit the nail on the head. It wasn't all lights and cocoa on the first Christmas with Jesus' birth. It was a little messier. A little simpler. And maybe our hearts want to experience that.

My Advent sermon series will build off of Erickson's book and beautiful artwork, like this piece, "Light." What an incredible interpretation of how Christ, the Light of the World, came to earth as a vulnerable baby, a fetus that grew in Mary, just as each of us developed. The Light came to dwell with us, to show us love, and to remind us we are beloved.

The world feels very dark now, but we have hope because the Light is coming, and we are called to share that with others. I pray we experience renewed hope this Advent and Christmas.





The weekly Chair Yoga session, previously held at 4:30 p.m. on Thurs-
