## **July 2020**

In his book Canoeing the Mountain, Tod Bolsinger uses the explorers Lewis and Clark's trek westward as an extended metaphor. They were searching for the highly anticipated Northwest Passage: water that would connect the eastern portion of the US to the Pacific ocean. After a great deal of travel already, finally, Meriweather Lewis and William Clark reached where they thought this passage would be and were ready to canoe easily towards the Pacific Ocean. They were shocked to see not a water passage, but rather the Rocky Mountains. How in the world were they to canoe mountains? This was not what they had anticipated.

While this metaphor and the book are helpful generally for ministry in our changing world, the image rings true for me all the more in our present time when trying to move forward confronting the realities of a world with COVID-19. When imagining the day I step into the role of solo pastor (which I've thought about since I was 16), I never imagined masks would be a necessity for worship. There are so many elements that I never anticipated.

I wonder if it's similar to how Joshua felt when he was about to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land? This was the moment he and generations before him had dreamed of...but there was so much unknown, so much he wasn't prepared for, so much uncertainty. To this moment, God gives a word of hope in Joshua 1:3-9:

"Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given to you, as I promised to Moses. From the wilderness and the Lebanon as far as the great river, the river Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites, to the Great Sea in the west shall be your territory. No one shall be able to stand against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will not fail you or forsake you. Be strong and courageous; for you shall put this people in possession of the land that I swore to their ancestors to give them. Only be strong and very courageous, being careful to act in accordance with all the law that my servant Moses commanded you; do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, so that you may be successful wherever you go. This book of the law shall not depart out of your mouth; you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to act in accordance with all that is written in it. For then you shall make your way prosperous, and then you shall be successful. I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

The call to be strong and courageous comes out three times in a relatively short passage. And the reason Joshua can be strong and courageous? Because God will go with them. God would be present every moment of their journey. An abiding strength and presence.

So as we navigate this uncharted territory of ministry together, I know God goes with us as well. We can be strong and courageous together. Though so much is unknown, I know there is goodness ahead and we'll have exciting new opportunities to share the Kingdom of God together. I couldn't be more delighted to adventure with you.





#### **Resuming In-Person Worship**

We recently had our Re-Launch team meet to determine a date and appropriate protocol to re-open. We had representatives from our Leadership Team, Worship Committee, and two medical professionals. We are excited to announce that we will begin meeting in person on Sunday, June 7 at 10:30. However, there will be some significant changes, and worship will feel and look very different. We will also be re-opening in phases. We encourage **anyone** who feels unsafe to stay home and worship with us online.

# There will be an in-depth, more explanatory e-mail and letter going out June 2 but for now, here is a little of what we are planning:

- Each family unit or individual party of one must be seated at a distance of 6 feet apart. We will have pew spaces clearly marked, and every other pew will be utilized to maintain social distancing.
- We are asking every person in attendance to please a
  wear a mask. This is for the safety of others. If you
  have medical issues that prevent this, we hope that
  you will remain in the safety of your home and sacrifice
  for the sake of others. We will have masks available at
  church for those who need one.

- There will be no congregational singing. Music will be provided via video.
- There will be no Sunday School classes for now. Worship only at 10:30 a.m.
- The first phase means that we can have no children's church or nursery. Children may sit with family, and Miria will have activities for them. But for now, until we implement phase 2, no kid's activities. We understand this is a hardship for young families and we wish it were different.
- Attendance will be taken for purposes of contact tracing in the event someone is later diagnosed as Covid positive.
- Small group ministries may resume after June 7, but must have less than 10 in attendance, and must maintain social distancing of 6 feet.
- Ushers will seat folks as they walk in, to ensure distancing, and maximize use of a limited space.
- Spaces will be sanitized after each use.
- Worship will continue to be posted online for viewing.
