#### Pastoral Letter

Money and finance often feel like a topic that makes us a little squirmy in the church. Maybe it even feels taboo because we don't like to talk about it in society in many ways. But Jesus speaks about money frequently in his teachings, and the rest of scripture has a lot to say as well. That's because it is so closely tied to how we're growing as disciples.

Talking about money has an added layer of stress in the season we're in: COVID-19 and an economic crisis can set everyone on edge when it comes to finance. It's a reality we're all living with.

Instead of dancing around the issue, we're going to call out the elephant in the room. The theme for our stewardship initiative is "Our Money Story." Money is not neutral for anyone. We all have a story when it comes to money. We all have gut reactions. These come from what we were taught or not taught, what we've experienced, and stories we've compiled. Maybe there are stories of fear and shame. Maybe there are stories of provision and grace. Whatever your money story is, I think when we lift them up to God, there's space for transformation to take place.

This series will go through the first four weeks of November, and we'll look at our stories through four lenses: Remember, Release, Reimagine, and Restore.

To go along with the sermon series and worship elements, we have a reflection journal for you to use. There's scripture, questions, art, and prayers. If you did not receive the email with the journal, please contact the church office. I encourage you to engage with the journal and spend a little time thinking about what your money story is, and how God might reshape it.

In the midst of the chaos, ministry is still happening. We are reaching out to those who feel lonely and disconnected right now. We are reimagining ministry in creative ways to adjust to the challenges COVID-19 presents.

To go with the stewardship series, you can also expect to receive a narrative budget that tells in greater detail the impact your giving has on our community. Be on the look out!

Our church is making a difference, and your investment makes that possible. I pray you'll engage this stewardship initiative, reflect on your own money story, and pray on what God is calling you to give.


