Pastoral Letter

As we wrap up a short series on part of the book of Ephesians, I am again reminded of the early church struggled with many trials we face today as well. Loving and being in community with other imperfect humans has never been easy, but this has always been the calling of Christ followers. The church in Ephesus found it difficult to put away bitterness and wrath.

And in our ever contentious society today, where we do not see eye to eye with our brothers and sisters in Christ on a whole myriad of issues, this challenge continues. As the pandemic continues, and we're all worn thin, it can be even harder.

I think that's where the way Paul calls us to live in Ephesians is helpful. To live in peace, forgive, and use words that build others up, as well as to take up the armor of God. In discussing the armor of God with my dad (whom many of you met when he preached at Skiatook FUMC a few weeks ago,) he suggested maybe armor of different times and places could extend the analogy. Soldiers in ancient Mongolia wore silk shirts because arrows could not penetrate the shirt, and it was pulling an arrow out of a warrior that caused the real damage. Thus, the shirt prevented the arrow from causing a real wound. My dad suggested there's a parallel in how grace functions in our lives. When we clothe ourselves in grace, barbs or unkind words roll off a little easier. We don't allow these things to sink in and fester. We let things go because we wrap ourselves in


grace. Maybe Paul would have included this if it too was part of a Roman soldier's uniform.

In these days where heated words can be launched easily, let us put on the armor of God, and bonus silk shirt of grace, as we live as Christ's body.



1 Corinthians is one of the most gripping books in the Bible. In this letter, Paul, the complicated, layered apostle, writes to the people trying




a wild new social experiment known as a Christian community. Not unlike the church today, this community dealt with factions, sexual immorality, gender issues, money issues, theological questions, lawsuits, problems in worship, and problems in leadership.

In 1 Corinthians: Searching the Depths of God, Jaime Clark-Soles explores these topics and the awe inspiring. breathtaking world of the firstcentury church. Examining the teachings of Paul, she addresses church history, the logic of the cross, spiritual gifts, death, afterlife and the resurrection, human sexuality, and the jovs and challenges of living in community. Participants will learn to look at 1 Corinthians from a variety of viewpoints and apply its lessons to their own faith.

An update on a few financial items for the church:

-Through a few designated gifts, we were able to order new Audio Visual equipment for the sanctuary. This will include new speakers (the current speakers are about 30 years old!), greatly improving sound for in person worship. It will also include new microphones, and new cameras that will enhance our ability to connect with people for online worship. Online worship has been a

wonderful tool for people to still join worship when they are out of town, not feeling well, unable to get out, or for guests to check us out for the first time! The company expects to be able to schedule installation in September. Thank you to those who generously gave to make these updates possible!

-In the dog days of Oklahoma summer heat, three air conditioning units at the church went out. These units had put in their time, and then some, so these updates were anticipated. Through two designated gifts, and reserve funds, we were able to cover the approximately \$22,000 with only about \$2,000 from the general fund.
