We selected the Friday-Saturday prior to the start of the new school year to conduct a Boys Survival Skills retreat. This was well received by the boys and their families. A total of 27 boys participated along with another nine leaders. Special thanks to Mike Stone of Fruitland Community Church for coming up with the idea and leading out in the planning and teaching for the retreat. Several commented that they would like to see us do more retreats like this for the boys.

We also were able to conduct a girl's retreat in September. It was led by Pattie Brooks of Trinity Baptist Church with 43 girls participating and 12 leaders. There was one salvation during the retreat and another four girls from the retreat surrendered their lives to Jesus the next day at church on Sunday!

We have a youth retreat scheduled for October 16-18. Tim Simmons, youth leader at Burfordville Baptist, is the director of this retreat and will be serving as the lead preacher. Daniel Maasen, worship pastor at First Baptist Jackson, is leading in worship for the weekend. On Friday night there is a special worship service being led by "Cape Collective", a group comprised of some of our area worship leaders!
