

Church Planting Center of Southeast Missouri – 2018/19 Report

It's been another year of growth and awareness for church planting in the Southeast Missouri Region! Here is just a brief report of church planting efforts in our region.

A few years ago, we contracted with Ednor Sebag as a church planting catalyst with Filipinos our area. He has worked in six different areas: Cape Girardeau, Jackson, Sikeston, Doniphan, Puxico, and Poplar Bluff with food events, building relationships with Filipinos throughout the region. He continues to relate to over 100 Filipinos in our region and has baptized at least six. This past December, they all gathered in Sikeston for a Christmas program. Look at this great group!



Ednor and his family became American citizens a year ago and he continues to grow his food truck business, "JJ's Roast-on-Wheels" to supplement his income.

A significant step was made this year to consolidate all the groups into two churches. One group has been meeting for over a year at Fruitland Community Church and the other is launching this month in Poplar Bluff. The first group has met an important milestone in identifying a leadership team that Ednor has begun to meet with regularly and they are taking more and more ownership.
