I love Fall in Guyton! Everywhere in the treeline is a dash of color. The air is clean, and the skies are as expansive as on any desert landscape. There's just a little bit of bussle in our downtown. We scan the calendar, happy to see Christmas approaching, welcoming the opportunity to dust off decorations and play that music that only plays once a year.

"Things are different this year," – I say every year. We're always adapting to changing conditions, changing weather, and changing needs in our church family. In those ways, things are no different than ever this year.

The usual Christmas gatherings are canceled, modified or replaced, but the replacement activities offer wonderful opportunities. For example, on the night of Sunday, Dec. 6, our Children's Christmas event is a walk along The Advent Trail for four retellings of Christmas story elements. The journey begins at the Christian Center around 6 p.m. It ends with Carols, hot chocolate, mulled cider and Christmas gifts at the Depot.

As we ease back into other schedules, we offer Sabbath @ My Father's House in the Christian Center for children and families at the 10 a.m. Sunday School hour. Dr. Michael Moore will teach a series on Advent for his Sunday School class in the Depot.

The choir is working on the Christmas Cantata, which is sure to spark some great memories. In so many ways our gatherings are smaller this year, but they are offered with love to each member of our church family. The Cantata will be presented in person and online at the Dec. 13 worship service and again the evening of Dec. 14, starting at 7 p.m. Both performances will be livestreamed on Facebook and available afterward on Youtube.

I am in constant awe of what God does to prepare us for things we didn't expect. For example, we know that we have more shut-ins than ever in this church family. Visiting can be difficult and risky. At the same time, we have a team of unplugged musicians who can be heard from a block away. Voila! A Christmas Greeting and socially-distant wellness check all rolled into one! Three songs and a prayer, and we just might make someone's Christmas. We will carol homes in and around Guyton on Sunday, Dec. 20, at 4 p.m., leaving from the Depot.

On Dec. 21 at 7 p.m., we will conduct our Blue Service in the Sanctuary. A blue service, commemorating the longest night of the year, is an acknowledgement of the sorrow that some of us feel over the holidays, or over the loss of a loved one. We will light candles in memory of those we have lost this year. We will share with one another the comfort that only Christ can give.

All considered, it's a busy Christmas season – but, then again, aren't they all? The Church has survived through the centuries because it has been able to adapt to many conditions: Plagues, wars, persecution, mass migration and all the other things that can go wrong. We are descended from hardy stock, tested season after season and ready to bounce from Christmas into the New Year and beyond.

As the song goes, "Many things about tomorrow I don't seem to understand. But I know who holds tomorrow, and I know who holds my hand." We are ready for Christmas. We are ready for whatever 2021 has in store for us. Because we know that our best path is to follow after our loving, forgiving, sacrificial Savior.







The True Meaning of Christmas (Movies)

What is a Christmas movie? On the face of it that seems like a silly question, or at least it seems like it has an easy answer: a Christmas movie is a movie about Christmas, or that takes place during the Christmas season. The problem with that definition is how broad to the point of uselessness it is. What, in this relatively secular age, does it mean to be "about Christmas"? The Hallmark Channel puts out something like 30 new Christmas movies each year, almost none of them have anything to do with the Birth of Christ. Sure, those movies take place during the Christmas season, and therefore are still Christmas movies based on the above definition. But is that really all it takes?



If a film can be considered a "Christmas Movie" simply because of the calendar date(s) the plot occurs during, then we have to acknowledge some truly bizarre flicks in the genre. Think about it: are *Iron Man 3*, *Lethal Weapon*, and *You've Got Mail* really "Christmas" movies? What do any of those movies have to do with Christmas, aside from an incidental element of their setting? Now *Home Alone*, I think, is clearly a Christmas movie; it doesn't just take place during Christmas, the entire plot revolves around what Kevin's family is doing for Christmas, and how he and they learn to value each other in the true spirit of the season. So now, the ultimate question: what about *Die Hard*?

I would argue that *Die Hard* is a Christmas Movie, but for only one member of the cast. Mrs. McClane starts *Die Hard* in a similar position to many of the heroines of the Hallmark Christmas movies we've already talked about. On Christmas Eve, she's too busy to spend time with her family, leaving her children with a nanny, and all but ignoring her estranged husband's attempts at reconciliation (until he foils a German terrorist plot, that is). By the time the credits roll though, her outlook has utterly flipped. I suppose that means that in order to be a true Christmas movie, a screenplay has to follow the basic outline of Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*, ghosts optional (though John McClane certainly makes a few new ghosts over the course of the plot).

I say all of this in good fun, because what truly makes a "Christmas Movie" is something of a trivial question. I know there are several good-hearted Christians who worry about what is often called the war on Christmas. And certainly none of the films I've mentioned so far have anything to say about Jesus Himself. Even A Christmas Carol has virtually no mention of the Birth of Christ. We could hold firm to the standard that, if it's not about the Lord Jesus and His birth, then it's not a Christmas Movie, but I feel this attitude is somewhat unhelpful. Let people have their fun with Christmas, let kids have their Santa Claus, and remember that when someone mentions "the True Spirit of Christmas," even though they may think they're referring to something safely non-religious, they're actually talking about the Holy Spirit. The third member of the Holy Trinity may be the one many people find the easiest to ignore if they so choose, but if you're really paying attention, I think He'll surprise you how often He shows up.
