In Harmony and Humility

"Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited." So says Paul in Romans 12:16.

Paul tells me how to *think* about ourselves and how to *treat* other people. Regarding my self-image, he says don't be conceited or wise in my own opinion. I should not consider myself better than others.

No matter how wise, no living human is all-knowing. I am instructed to "be willing to associate with people of low position" (NIV), also translated as "enjoy the company of ordinary people" (NLT), "associate with the humble" (NKJV), "condescend to men of low estate" (KJV), or "associate with people who have no status" (CEB). The verse tells me to seek friendship with people whose status is less than my own. I need to be humble in my estimation and peaceable in my treatment of others.

In Romans 12:10, Paul says, "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves." There are so many points of stress and tension in the world today. But we have the power to make things better. That power is in how we treat others, especially those we may see as being wrong, foolish, less than, or irrelevant.

Jesus put it even more plainly: Love one another. May we always try our best to live up to His standards and not our own. May we be humble and quick to honor others above ourselves. And may we pray without ceasing for God's will in our lives.



At time of writing, I have just reached my office after being at the Effingham County Courthouse since a little before 9 o'clock this morning (August 25th, 2020). Don't worry! Your humble

Youth Coordinator was not in any trouble. In fact, I was in one of the only groups who were happy to be there. My dear friends Kennith and Whitney finalized the adoption of their baby girl today. Her name is now, officially, Jenna Pearl Bennett.

I was deeply honored to be asked to witness this momentous event in their lives: to help taking pictures, to be in a few pictures myself, to laugh with the family at the judge's and the lawyer's jokes, and to observe one of the few elements of our legal system that makes everyone involved with it incredibly happy. The judge said that he believed we had a record number of people crammed into his little conference room (25, unless I've forgotten anyone, including the family's lawyer, the judge, Jenna's DFCS caseworker, 2 clerks, 3 children, and of course friends and family like myself, all masked-up and grouped by household). It was an experience I will treasure all of my life. And it reminded me of our relationship with God.

Did you know that God has adopted us into his own family? Paul makes this point twice, once in Ephesians 1:5 and once in Galatians 4:5-7. Through Christ, we have been adopted into God's family, so that we are no longer bound by our sins, but children of God, and not just children, but heirs—co-heirs with Christ in eternal life. See, Jenna has one natural-born sibling (so far): a baby sister named Caroline. If this were still a time where such things mattered, and my friends were going by God's adoption protocol, then Jenna would receive the greater inheritance since she is older. With us and God, however, Christ is the firstborn. Indeed He is the Firstborn over all creation, but that's an article for another time.

What makes this story even more of a happy ending is that Jenna was adopted out of the foster system. The ordeal of adopting a child in that circumstance is a challenge and a half, as I have now seen first-hand (maybe second-hand). Jenna's father Kennith said it makes him think of our relationship to God, in contrast with that of the angels. He told me "angels have a direct connection to God and they get to see Him all the time. They have had Him since He created them, whereas we humans first wait with our 'foster family' here on Earth." I thought that was such a beautiful sentiment that I needed to share it with you as fully as I could.

Think of it like this: God loves us so much that He sent His Son to save us and bring us into a right relationship with Him, but in the meantime, He also sends us people who love and care for us on Earth as well. I rejoice so much that Jenna has been sent to the Bennett's who will care for her in all the ways that her biological parents were unable to and more. I can't wait to watch her grow into a strong young woman in Christ as I know she will under Kennith & Whitney's care. I'm so thankful to be included in their family by love. And I'm thankful for each of you, and our Church Family that God sent me to after a long search.

Perfect Timing

September $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$, marks one year since I was baptized at Guyton Christian with friends and family in attendance.

That decision was years in the making. Having been baptized as an infant and having no memory of it, I had contemplated and prayed over the possibility of a re-baptism for at least ten years.

The interesting thing about the timing, is that I had never quite gotten a clarity about baptism in all those years. Yet when I knew it was right, there was an urgency I didn't understand. Incredibly, all five of my sons were available to join us that holiday weekend, and my heart was full of joy.

As is often the case, God's timing proved to be perfect. The weeks following my baptism were the most difficult and painful of my life. To this day I stand amazed at the perfect way God set things in motion.

The lingering effects of that day, the ceremony, the public declaration, and the love of those who showed up to support me, comforted me immeasurably in the weeks ahead.

The memory of that moment assured me of God's abiding presence. It was a perfectly timed and beautiful reminder that God loved my mother and she would be with Him soon. Not once did I feel alone and I knew God held both of our hands.

Ten years may seem like a ridiculous amount of time to ponder baptism for us. But God knew exactly what I needed and when I needed it most.

These unfamiliar times, filled with frustrating changes for our churches, could be viewed as a time of reflection and renewal, maybe even a re-birth. So many things are beyond our control and we must rely fully on our faith. We must trust that He is in control and preparing us for better days. Whatever lies ahead, we can trust that God is always working for our good.

We are understandably impatient for those things that we miss. We find comfort together, in hugs and in handshakes. Things seem a bit unnatural just now, and we want our normal back soon, on our timeline.

But in the stillness of our faithful hearts and minds we trust in God's timing. We listen for His voice, we wait for Him and we follow.

He knows exactly what we need and when we need it most.

"Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD." – Psalm 27:14 KJV
