

Our **Feeding the Hungry** program provides meals to anyone who is hungry on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5 to 6:30 p.m. We offer indoor dining or as take-out. **PLEASE**, we need cooks and other volunteers. Contact Laurel Hostler, Christina Kalat or the church office.

Food Pantry

Our Food Pantry distributes baskets on Thursdays, from 9 to 11:45 a.m. There are no income restrictions, but you must reside in Show Low, Linden, Pinedale, Clay Springs, White Mountain Lakes, or the "Y" area of Vernon, You are eligible for a full basket once per calendar month and can get bread and produce (when available) on other Thursdays. Bring a photo ID every time and verification of address (utility bill or government document) on your first visit.

If you are planning to attend the meal, please use the tearoff to give us an idea of how many are coming. Please enter through the Fellowship Hall doors.




Fellowship Time & Ministry Conference:
