#### Pastoral letter:

Dear Friends,

I hope and pray that you are well this day! These are certainly different days. We have been witnessing many events in recent days and weeks that challenge us to learn and grow as individuals, as a country, and a church. Along with you, I have heard stories and watched videos of people being harassed, harmed, and murdered because of the color of their skin.

Jesus said, "love your neighbor as yourself." It is part of the 2 great commandments. When asked what were the greatest commandments, those most important rules to follow, Jesus responded, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these" (Mark 12:29-31). Time is overdue for all of us to say black lives matter. Everyone who is a person of color matters in our world.

On a personal level, it fills me with shame that my white children can go in our neighborhood and throughout our community and not feel unsafe or considered to be outsiders when other children cannot, because of how they are perceived, due to the color of their skin. My white children can see police and not be afraid. I will never have to have that talk with them, where other peers will have to be careful about what they say and do so that they can return home alive. It is wrong and so sad that in 2020 in upstate New York that this sin still runs rampant in our country.

Before these days, these conversations might have felt unnecessary to us because we feel as if we are a small, insulated community. It is time that we take to reflect upon why Sunday morning is among the most segregated time in the United States. What might we be willing to do to learn and work for justice in our world?

This moving service encourages us to reflect and be called to action with prayer, music, scripture, and brief reflections from people throughout our United Methodist connection. I would also encourage you to consider how we might begin the work of dismantling racism in our world. Macedon Center is currently in conversation with the people at Gonandagan, in order that we might learn from them and partner with them to support their work for the Native American Community. As we return to in person worship and activities in the future, it is my hope that we can gather with the purpose of discussing racism and how we might work against it.

"With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?" He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?
