Blessed to Me

"Praise the Lord! You who serve the Lord — praise! Praise the Lord's name! Let the Lord's name be blessed from now until forever from now! From sunrise to sunset, let the Lord's name be praised! The Lord is high over all the nations; God's glory is higher than the skies!" — Psalm 113

"From sunrise to sunset" and all throughout our every 24 hours, God is with us. What if we saw our sleeping and waking, the rituals of our getting up and getting out, the rhythms of our work, play, and rest, as rife with blessing? Our worship series this month will introduce us to an ancient spirituality where the spirit of Christ resides within and all around us. Celtic Christianity sees God in all things, and God's presence and blessings in every encounter and every moment of our day.

The ancient Christian practice of "blessing" encourages us to recognize the sacred in the mundane things and tasks of life. The Celts believed in "thin" places – places where the boundary between our day-to-day world and the sacred was "thin" and sometimes transparent. The ancient practice of "pilgrimage,"

takes the pilgrim to new places with the expectation of encountering God. As we approach the summer vacation time, we can plan our trips with an intent to notice the sacred everywhere we go.

Remember to bring back a small amount of water from a river, ocean, pool, pond, or lake that you visit this summer. As we mix and bless the waters, we symbolically bring back and share with our faith community, the blessings that we have received on our pilgrimages.

We are on a pilgrimage together. For the next nine months, along with our usual events and worship, you and I are preparing for my retirement at the end of February, 2019, and getting everything ready to welcome a new pastor. By filling out the "CAT Scan" questionnaire, you have already helped the search committee with their work of preparing a church profile to post on the United Church of Christ job opportunities list. That will be complete soon and next they will be receiving profiles from qualified candidates and conducting interviews.

SIMPLIFIED COFFEE HOUR

Our Deacons have out their heads together and come up with a simplified format so it will be easier for more people to volunteer host. A few simple items:

Hospitality

- Dip and chips (salsa or hummus, etc. and any kind of chip)
- Fruit or veggies
- Finger desserts
- Cheese and crackers
- Half and Half (for coffee/tea)

Instructions for making the coffee are on the back of the cabinet door where the coffee and tea are stored. 20 cups is usually enough.

And to keep it green:

Please use the ceramic mugs (top shelf) in the coffee cabinet so we can eliminate the need for the disposable hot cups — Please use the spoons and plates in the drawers and cabinets near the counter. Use the small dishwasher to clean them but don't run it unless it is full.

Put the Britta water pitcher on the coffee/tea table with a few (glass) water glasses.

Please sign up on the list in the church hall on the bulletin board, or by emailing the church office. If you've never done it, but want to, ask a Deacon of the Month for some help.

Proposed Changes to the By-Laws

ARTICLE VI: GOVERNANCE AND

OVERSIGHT

SECTION 6: TREASURER

C. The Treasurer shall be financially compensated in an amount agreeable to the

Treasurer and Council. In the event of a hired Bookkeeper, the Treasurer shall

oversee the Bookkeeper, and shall be a volunteer position. The Bookkeeper shall

be financially compensated and considered a staff member of the Church.

ARTICLE VII: ADVISORY BOARDS, TEAMS, AND COMMITTEES

SECTION 2: FINANCE COMMITTEE

A. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Treasurer of the Church, *the*

Bookkeeper if applicable, and three members elected annually by the Church.
