MUSINGS OF A SENIOR CITIZEN

I have had many opportunities for quiet reflection in the past few months. I have taken this time to evaluate my relationship with God and with my brothers and sisters in the church. The question that is uppermost in my mind is, "Am I walking worthily?" In Ephesians 4:1-3 Paul states, "I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beseech you to walk worthily of the calling wherewith ye were called, with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; giving diligence to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

In the Christian tradition, we recognize the call to the gospel ministry, but relegate all other "calls" to a lesser position in the church. The Body is comprised of many members who have many different talents and abilities. Would it not follow that those gifts are to be used for the Body? And would it not be a calling to use those gifts for kingdom building? We are called when we respond to the Gospel.

This scripture exhorts us to walk in meekness and lowliness. We are to follow the example set by Jesus to be servants. Meekness and lowliness is best exemplified through the gentleness displayed by Jesus. A meek person is one who is considerate. They are able to put themselves in the other person's situation. The meek person is not a hothead. They demonstrate self-control as they seek to be a witness to the world. We must be slow to anger. We need to demonstrate exhibit understanding and self-control when we are wronged. A loving attitude should be on constant display.

I know that I have a calling. My calling is teaching. I have an inordinate level of patience with children. I am very tolerant of most of their antics. I love seeing their faces light up when they "get it". Their inquisitiveness is exciting. Their energy is invigorating. It's exciting. I love every moment of it.

When I say children, I am referring to little people under the age of ten. People above that age really present a challenge for me. I had an occasion recently to teach a group of teenagers. After thirty minutes, any meekness and lowliness I had was long gone. I was not able to put myself in their place as we discussed Ephesians 6 10-14. Seven of them were rude, obnoxious, and loud. One member of the group was more reserved and seemed to be interested in participating in the discussion. The next thirty minutes was spent with the two of us interacting. If this was a test, then I failed miserably. I was unable to walk worthily in my calling. I gave up on the seven. I let my annoyance keep me from trying to determine how I could have reached them.

I did not practice patience, endurance, steadfastness, or perseverance. I missed an opportunity to demonstrate God's love that night. I failed in my calling. I need to remember that even teenagers are my brothers and sisters.

Screamin' Ice Cream

Gather

- ♦ 1 cup milk
- ▶ 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- ◆ 1 gallon −size plastic freezer bag
- 1 quart-size freezer bag
- ♦ 1/8 cup sugar
- ♦ Ice
- ♦ 2tbs rock salt

Go

- 1. Pour the milk, vanilla extract and sugar into the quart-size freezer bag. Seal it tightly.
- 2. Put the quart-size bag into the gallon freezer bag. Fill up the empty space in the gallon bag with ice.
- 3. Add the rock salt to the ice to help it melt. Make sure the bag is zipped tightly.
- 4. Shake and roll the bag around until the ice cream is as thick as desired. It should take around 7 minutes.
- 5. Makes approximately 3 servings. Repeat if you need more and enjoy your homemade vanilla ice cream with a friend!
