Not too long ago while preparing to wash dishes I took a look at the bottle of bleach that sat next to the dish detergent under my sink. My mind went to my Kentucky family. (This is family in which I've been grafted.) I thought of when the patriarch of the family, Mr. B., was ill and his wife and daughters, in order to keep his environment as sterile as possible, splashed bleach into their dish water. I'd never seen anyone do that before.

I was never much of a bleach user, except in extreme cases. You know... when a deep stain or odor needed removing. I would buy it, but rarely use it.

My mind took me back to early in my walk with the Lord; of how I would petition Him only in times of dire straits. "Regular" prayer was one thing; but to bother the Lord unless it was ABSOLUTELY necessary was out of the question. I had access to Him, but rarely called on Him. I kept Him in the cabinet under the sink.

You know how it is when you walk into (especially) a kitchen or a bathroom and are confronted with that bleach smell. There's an assurance that, "somebody's been cleaning".

I gave my dishes their own splash. As I scrubbed, I inhaled that clean bleach aroma and it reminded me of the Holy Spirit. I can have Him and keep Him tucked away, but unless I access Him and His power in my life what's the use. It's as easy as praying to the Lord and allowing the Holy Spirit to pour into the dirty dish dishes situations that life throws at me. That bleach smell of a fresh cleansing is like when the Spirit is at work in one's life; there's assurance of peace and well-being. When I walk into the situation there is assurance that the Spirit is hard at work. "Some Body's been cleaning!"

So, I now not only use bleach for the tough stains, I use it for the everyday mundane task of washing dishes. Likewise, as I've grown in my walk, the Lord has shown me that His Spirit it accessible to me in all situations; the tough and the mundane. My praise offering is a sweet-smelling aroma to Him, and His favor over my life is like the smell of Him bleaching away the attempts to steal His great gifts of peace and joy!


