Alert Solano: www.AlertSolano.com The County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services launched a new and improved emergency notification system, Alert Solano, at the end of June.

1. In the event of an emergency, public safety officials can send a message about a potential safety hazard or concern.
2. This system allows users to provide customized information for the most efficient delivery of emergency information. Participants can register up to five addresses and it is recommended every person in a household sign up.
3. Alerts can be sent to all devices listed in the Alert Solano account, maximizing the chances of alerting users in a timely manner.
4. A land-line will work for notifications, but a computer is needed to sign up for Alert Solano.
