PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Scot Sorensen, Interim Pastor



First of all, I want to say THANK YOU. Thank you for the many kind and generous ways that you have welcomed me, your carpet-bagger interim pastor, especially during this Advent and Christmas season. Your sweet treat, gifts, and cards have meant a great deal to me. Thank you.

Second, as we turn the page on 2021 and open the calendar to 2022, I want to share with you all a bit of what might be in front of us as a community of Jesus followers known as Shepherd of the Hills.

- Pandemic: Regardless of what we might hope for, the reality is that the pandemic continues to be a real health threat to us and everyone across our globe. Omicron is spreading fast and positivity rates are going up. That will mean, unfortunately, that we will be going back to individual communion cups in the pews, using the 'eucharistables' on January 2 (you are still welcome to bring your own bread and wine if you prefer.) Our benchmark is for Solano County to have a positivity rate below six percent for us to share communion from the altar.
- Pandemic Part 2: As of writing this article, over 275 million people around the world and 5,400,000 deaths. Here in the United States, there have been over 51 million cases and 812,000 deaths. These numbers are so large that we may grow numb, but we dare not. We are commanded to love our neighbor, which means that we grieve with those who grieve. As we enter this new year and recognize that we are tempted to grow weary in our vigilance as well as compassion, we must for the sake of each other allow the Holy Spirit to expand our hearts of compassion. As is said in Galatians 6:9, "let us not grow weary in doing what is right."
- Call Process: You will read an update from the Call Committee in another location in the January Horn. What I want to share with you is this: 1) Keep them in your prayers. This process will not be successful unless we entrust it to God. 2) Be prepared in Lent to attend the 'Soup-suppers' where the Call Committee will be seeking congregation input on such important questions as "What is our purpose?" "Why are we here at 580 Trinity Drive?" "What are you passionate about?" "Where do you see God at work in our neighborhood?"

Theological Conversations

Theology is a conversation. It involves speaking and listening, understanding and sharing understanding, and it consists of words written or spoken among two or more people for a specific purpose. In an evangelical faith community, like the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, theological conversations serve a purpose related to the Evangel, the message of good news in Jesus Christ that the Scriptures proclaim. In other words, evangelical theological conversation serves the full and free expression of the gospel in the life of the world.

Evangelical, Lutheran theology does several things. Participants in evangelical theological conversations attend to the goodness of the gospel message — the specific good that God does in Jesus Christ's cross and resurrection. They also seek the language and actions that give the most winsome expression to this compassionate mercy and liberating hope.

In these conversations many questions need attention and many viewpoints are helpful. All participants have something to contribute. The resources available in the Theological Conversations section invite you into this conversation that serves the gospel's free course in the life of the world.

This is the twelfth year that the Joy Book Club has met to discuss a wide variety of books. We are back to meeting in person at Lou Barela's home but

the pandemic taught us to use Zoom and currently at least one member attends virtually. To date, we have read 143 books together. Books are selected by the members of club and we try to include at least one nonfic-

tion, one religious and one classic book each year. Book topics range widely from very serious to light-hearted and any genre that takes a member's fancy.

Shepherd of the Hills has a group of people who turn fabric and stuffing into useful Lutheran World Relief (LWR) quilts. Recipients of the quilts might

use it for warmth, as a covering (tent), as a table spread out on the ground, or as a suitcase to carry possessions. LWR quilt ministry is a long-standing mission responding to disasters around the U.S. and the world.

Our quilting group developed from the small group, Women's Evening Bible Study which is not currently meeting. LWR is part of the ECLA of which SOTH is a member. Our group will be meeting

in the Big Room at Shepherd of the Hills from noon to around 2:00. We will continue meeting usually on the first Sunday of the month. Refer to the calendar, email blasts, and the website for specific dates. All are welcome to stop by and see how the quilts are assembled. No sewing skills or prior experience is needed if you choose to participate.

Every fall, completed quilts are collected at designated places throughout the U.S., then trucked to LWR warehouses for storage until needed for a disaster response anywhere in the U.S. or in the world. See the Lutheran World Relief website, www.lwr.org for more information.



CARE CALLERS -




We are beginning a weekly Bible study on Wednesday, Jan. 12th. We will meet from 6:30-8:00 at church.


Looking forward,

- We are continuously striving to lock down the webpage. We got so close, and then the website went down and we had to rebuild it. If you are a member of the Steering Team or the leader of a small


group, please check our webpage http://www.discovertheshepherd.org/ to make sure that the information about your team/group is accurate.


- I will continue to work on trying to make things in the office more efficient, but I am still learning some things. I finally got the main voicemail and the office voicemail changed! Baby steps.
