THE IMPORTANCE OF GRATITUDE



As the calendar turns to November it is a time to re-focus our attention on giving thanks and gratitude. The Bible is replete with examples of giving thanks; from Abraham, Deborah, and David in the Old Testament to Jesus, Peter, and Paul in the New Testament. But it is not just your pastor who encourages you to give thanks because it is good for your spiritual health, your doctor knows it is good for your physical and mental health, too.

Recently the Harvard Medical School published an article calling attention to the benefits of giving thanks. "The word gratitude is derived from the Latin word gratia, which means grace, graciousness, or gratefulness (depending on the context). In some ways, gratitude encompasses all of these meanings. Gratitude is a thankful appreciation for what an individual receives, whether tangible or intangible. With gratitude, people acknowledge the goodness in their lives. In the process, people usually recognize that the source of that goodness lies at least partially outside themselves. As a result, being grateful also helps people connect to something larger than themselves as individuals - whether to other people, nature, or a higher power."

Naturally, we understand that 'higher power' is our Creator and Savior. And yes, the source of that goodness lies outside of ourselves. We have experienced that connection to something larger than ourselves, namely Jesus when we practice deliberate gratitude.

The article continues, "In positive psychology research, gratitude is strongly and consistently associated with greater happiness. Gratitude helps people feel more positive emptions, relish good experiences, improve their health, deal with adversity, and build strong relationships."

There are over 150 admonitions to give thanks in the Bible. Here are just two, "give thanks in all circumstances" (I Thes 5:18), "I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart," (Psalm 9:1)."

But, as we roll into the 21st month of the pandemic giving thanks is not always front of mind, let alone an easy thing to do. There has been too much death, too much loneliness and separation, too much anger and division, too much hatred and spite. In order to face this onslaught, we must practice the words of Scripture and give thanks in all circumstances. Notice, we are not tasked with giving thanks *for* all circumstance, but *in* all circumstances.

Recently in a sermon I asked the congregation to look for Jesus in their daily walk of life. Here is the other side of that assignment: give thanks. When we look for Jesus, we will see Jesus. And when we give thanks, we will be grateful people. And as grateful people we will more easily connect with God and others... and be happier, healthier children of God.

TIDYING OUR TEMPLE

The recent rain tested out the "new" berm that was created near the end of the stub road just down from the pre-school classrooms last summer, and I'm happy to say it passed. The berm was created to divert water runoff

away from the houses, just down the hill, to the concrete ditch to avoid any going over the bank into their backyards. Upon checking the area out, all the water was either going to the concrete ditch or to the gutters on each side of the stub road.

Considering the amount of rain we got, the buildings and grounds survived quite well. There was some water that found its way in at each of the back corners of the sanctuary, which is not a new thing when we get considerable rain all at one time. Also, the gutter on the back side of the SHY building over-flowed due to it not being cleaned before the rain (overlooked at fall cleanup), and the down spout is plugged. Both of these areas will be addressed as needed to try to avoid a repeat.

The continuous and never-ending weekly pine needle and debris cleanup is being handled by our hardworking stewards. We also had some of the pallets from the back forty removed, which were delivered to a business in Green Valley.

Creeds

Like the Scriptures, the three ecumenical creeds — the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed - are written documents. They originate from the earliest centuries of the Christian church's history, a time when theological and philosophical questions about the identity of Jesus were widely debated among Christians. All three creeds affirm that God is fully present in Jesus, that Jesus Christ is both God and human (not a semi-divine or superhuman creature that is neither). These three creeds are called ecumenical because they are all accepted and used by the overwhelming majority of the world's Christians. All three are affirmed in the Lutheran confessional writings and in the ELCA's governing

documents.

Although these three creeds, like the Scriptures, are written, most Christians experience and use them spoken aloud with other Christians in worship. Along with many other Christians, Lutherans use the Apostles' Creed at baptism; it is also the Creed most often used in basic Christian education (as in the Small Catechism). Lutheran Christians often use the Nicene Creed at festivals like Easter and Christmas and during seasons of the year related to those festivals. Some Lutheran congregations recite the Athanasian Creed on Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost) because of its focus on the relationships between the persons of the Triune God.




