Faithfulness

What is faithfulness? Faithfulness means to be true and loyal to someone. For our purpose here, it is about being loyal to our Lord Jesus Christ. To live like Jesus Christ is special because it is quite different from living with the sin nature that we were born with. Christians sometimes face difficulties such as rejection or ridicule from those who do not believe in Jesus Christ or even from other Christians! At other times we could face some difficult circumstances that may not arise from anyone's making, such as the loss of a loved one or property or failure. Therefore we are encouraged *to remain faithful* to God.

Our text says *"...unmoveable..."* So, we must be faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ no matter the challenges we face. Jesus showed us a secret of strength, that is praying often. We must do the same in order to receive strength from God. Another key character is total submission to God's will. It helps us to accept and surrender our will to God and follow His divine plan like our Lord Jesus did. (Luke 22:42) Also, we need to continue in fellowship with our fellow Christians to draw encouragement until Jesus returns to take us home.

Family Prayer: *Dear Lord Jesus, enable me by Your grace to remain faithful to You even when it is most difficult just like You were faithful while on earth. Help me to love other people no matter how they treat me and to endure hardship when necessary, in Your precious name, Jesus, amen.*
