


Strengthening Apostolic Families Everywhere



"Hearing of thy love and faith, which thou hast toward the Lord Jesus, and toward all saints;"

Philemon 1:5



There were many things that the Apostle Paul addressed to the church in the house of Philemon and Apphia. However, we are focusing on what Paul acknowledged about this family at the outset of his letter. For it was these qualities, found in verse 5, that allowed him to address all the other important issues. They had a love and faith toward Jesus Christ and toward all the saints.

Jesus said that all men would know you are my disciples if you have love one for another. Our love for others is not because they are perfect or that they deserve our love. Our love for others should be the same kind of love Jesus showed us as described in Romans 5:8, "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." When we didn't deserve His love, He still loved us. True love is determined by the will and not emotions.

However, it is not enough that we just love people. We must also have faith in them. It is true that people will let us down. They will disappoint us. That is a fact of life. However, when we lose faith in humanity, it will hinder our ability to help them. We must not be so distrustful of people that we are always questioning their motives and distancing ourselves from them. To love people is to make ourselves vulnerable to hurts and disappointments. Paul speaks of the house of Stephanas in 1 Corinthians 16:15. They had addicted themselves to the ministry of the saints. When we have faith in the saints then we will see our efforts to help them as a ministry. This is a good addiction that the church in your house can have.

Family Prayer: Lord, the Apostle Paul could see the faith demonstrated in the house of Philemon and Apphia. Please let my home be one that clearly shows the love and faith we have for you and our church family.
