Redeemed By the Blood


The word redeemed simply means to gain or regain possession of something in exchange for payment. There is a story about a boy who made a little sailboat. When he took it to the lake to sail it, the wind caught the sail and pushed the boat out of his sight. A few weeks later he saw his sailboat in the window of a store and asked the owner the price. Because he loved the sailboat so much, he worked, saved his money and went back to the store and bought it. As he was leaving the store, someone heard him say; "You are mine twice. First, because I made you and second, because I bought you."

This story illustrates what God did for us. As our Creator, He made us. However, when men began to sail on the sea of life, the winds of sin took us far from God. We were lost. Sin and Satan had us in their possession. In order for God to regain possession of us, He came to earth in the form of a man and paid the great price by dying upon the cross of Calvary. Jesus could not regain possession of us with money. The price for our redemption was His precious blood.

Now we must obey Acts 2:38... "Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."

When we are baptized the blood is applied to our lives and our sins are washed away. When we receive the Holy Ghost we are now fully redeemed and have been returned to the possession of God. We are now His, twice. First, because He made us: second, because He bought us.

Family Prayer: "Jesus, thank you for purchasing our salvation with your precious blood. We never want to forget the sacrifice you made for us on Calvary. In Jesus' name, amen."





Gather supplies to make a visual reminder of the price Jesus paid for our sins. Glue two popsicle (or other flat sticks) together to form a cross. Then glue coins to the cross. Mount your cross on a small poster board or place in a picture frame with the words, "Jesus paid the price."

Let's talk

Some church groups have taken songs that mention the blood of Jesus out of their songbooks. They say it's too gory. Why is it important that we continue to talk and sing about the precious blood of Jesus?
