#### Looking at the Upcoming transition...

One of the first things members learn about the Presbyterians is that we are a "Connectional Church." That is certainly the case in the process of selecting a new pastor. I am Rev. Sandy Winter and I will be your "connection" (liaison) to the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) during the search process. I am pleased that I will be walking along beside you during this time and hope that I can be helpful. I was ordained in 1980 and have served churches in Northern California and Tuscaloosa, Alabama. In 2006 I retired to Chattanooga, because I have a son and grandchildren here. I preached at New Hope once – the Sunday before Keith became your pastor!

So what lies ahead?

Two important things will happen shortly. 1) The Committee selected to work with Judd Shaw (our General Presbyter) on locating an Interim will make that selection. Soon you will have an interim minister in place. 2) There will be a Called Congregational Meeting to elect your Pastor Nominating Committee. (PNC) This is the committee that will do the work of nominating a new pastor. They will have periodic congregational meetings to update you on their process, but the specifics of their work need to be confidential.

When the PNC is in place, you will go through the process of a congregational mission study, looking at where you have been and where you are, but more to the point, where you want to go as a church. Don't be tempted to just hurry and fill in the blanks on the Mission Study. It will be of great help to you as well as to those who consider coming to New Hope. The remainder of the process will include gathering names of potential candidates, studying their information, narrowing the list, interviewing some, inviting someone to meet with the committee and preach in a "neutral pulpit" (i.e. not New Hope.) At some point the PNC will present a candidate to the congregation. And the congregation takes the vote!

If you are not on the PNC, do not feel left out. One thing you can do is to support them by not asking them to give you information that they have to keep confidential. And especially, don't rush them! In this process it is much more important to be careful and intentional than it is to be in a hurry. The most important thing is your prayers - keep the committee members and the candidates being considered as well as the entire process in your prayers!

# GREEN Green Consumption

According to a resource called Enough for Everyone (part of the Presbyterian Hunger Program; www.pcusa.org/justliving), a major contributor to the global environmental crisis is human consumption. Is the packaging biodegradable, recyclable, or will it pollute creation by remaining in a landfill? How long do I expect this item to last and what will I do with it once it can no longer be used? Is there a more sustainable option, a more ecologically friendly option or an option that was produced locally?"


