PROPERTY UPDATE

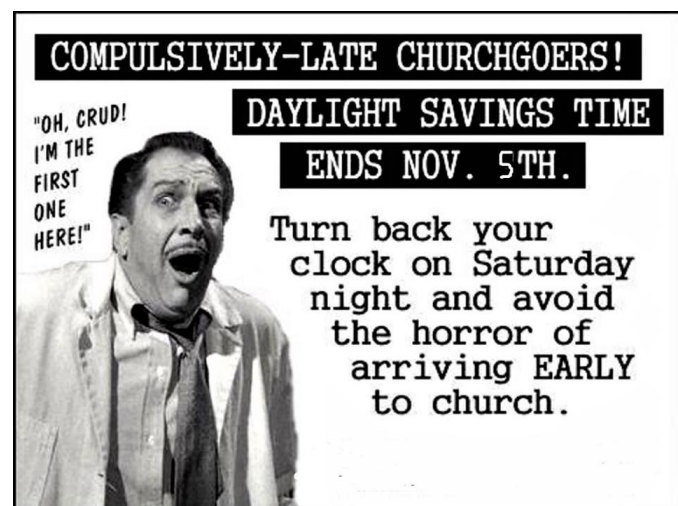
