Ready or not, all of us have begun transitioning into autumn. Most years, I eagerly anticipate the crisp air, fall colors, and everything else that comes with what has traditionally been my favorite season of the year. So far, 2016 seems to be no exception. This also happens to be a time of transition for St. James, as I have begun serving as your priest in New Castle. I'm very pleased to be with you, and feel blessed. Thanks to everyone who attended our first Service of Holy Eucharist together on September 18. Let me also express gratitude to all who contributed to the great pitch-in meal afterwards. Four friends of mine from Indianapolis and Greenfield attended the service and stayed for the pitch-in, and all of them were delighted by St. James' hospitality.

Because I will be serving St. James on a half-time, twenty-hour-a-week basis, in keeping with the recommendations of the Diocese I will be with you two Sundays per month. Those will be the first and third Sundays of each month. Occasionally, there will be an exception. In fact, the first of those will come up at the end of October, which has five Sundays this year. As a result, St. James will celebrate Eucharist on October 2, 16 and 30. Please join us! On the other Sundays, the parish will offer Morning Prayer. I also encourage you to attend that beautiful service, which dates back to our beginnings as Anglicans.

In addition to my Sundays at St. James, I will be in New Castle each Tuesday afternoon.

It's my plan to spend some afternoons in the office, but I will also be getting out and about. I have already been with two parishioners to visit a longtime member at her residence, and I look forward to additional visits. During my first week at St. James, I felt privileged to take part in the 2nd annual Peace Walk organized by First Friends Meeting and St. James. There were about twenty five participants. Congratulations to all who helped make it happen, and to all in attendance. Our featured speaker, Professor Wazir Mohamed of Indiana University East in Richmond, gave a timely, educational talk that dispelled common myths about Muslims and quoted from scripture passages in the Koran encouraging peace. This was a great outreach project and ecumenical collaboration.

In case you haven't already noticed, I'm just beginning to get to know both the parish and the New Castle area. I am slowly developing a list of people and places I'd like to see. If you have suggestions, please let me know.

I am making plans to continue serving St. James, as well as St. Paul's, Richmond, for the indefinite future. Although the official shared ministry with St. Paul's, Richmond, has expired, Bishop Waynick has said that I should continue working with both parishes until our new bishop is installed. The Community of Deacons regularly meets with our bishop in March and perhaps he or she will be present with us then, even though their installation will be in April. The new bishop may wish to deploy deacons differently than at present, or they may wish to re-assign particular deacons to different parishes than they now serve. In the meantime, I am making plans to work in both parishes through Pentecost Sunday, June 4.

TEACHING SERIES starts OCTOBER 2

The "Five Marks of Mission" will be the topic of discussion during the upcoming months, through February. These discussions will be opportunities to explore the meaning of mission as understood in the Anglican Community around the globe. They will allow us to look at how St. James has engaged "mission" until now and how we feel God might be leading us in the future.

Fr. Whitney and Deacon Barry are collaborating to present the topics and to guide the parish in reflecting on their implications for St. James. The series will begin on Sunday, October 2 and will continue on November 6, December 4, January 8, and February 5. These sessions will be in lieu of other forum topics during those months. The sessions will take place following the worship service and coffee hour and will be about 45 minutes to an hour in length. Please join us as you are able.

Dr. Grace Burton-Edwards, Rector of St. Thomas Church, Columbus, Georgia; The Rev. Dina van Klaveren, Rector of St.

Andrew's Church, Glenwood, Maryland; and the Rev. Canon Lance Ousley, Priest-in-Charge of St. John's Church, Parish and Preschool, Kirkland, Washington, and Canon for Stewardship and Development for the Diocese of Olympia. Walk-Abouts are set for Friday, Oct. 14 through Sunday, Oct. 16 in four locations throughout the Diocese of Indianapolis. St. Paul's at 6050 N. Meridian St. in Indianapolis will host the first Walk-About with check-in starting at 6:30 p.m. Friday. St. Andrew's at 520 E. Seminary St. in Greencastle will host the first Walkabout on Saturday, with check-in starting at 9:30 a.m. Check-in will begin at 3:30 p.m. Saturday at St. Paul's at 301 S. E. First St., Evansville. Walk-Abouts will conclude at St. Paul's at 2651 California St. in Columbus, with check-in beginning at 2:30 p.m. Sunday.

These events provide a way to introduce nominees to the people of the Indianapolis Diocese. Deputies and clergy voting in the Oct. 28 election should attend one of the Walk-About sessions. Others are also welcome.
