Session Highlights:

January 12, 2020 Called-Session Meeting

Moderator Rev. Dr. Catherine Knott and Rev. Susan McGhee, Executive Presbyter of the Presbytery of Ohio Valley discussed next steps to take toward finding a new pastor:

-The Session will form an Interim Pastor Nominating Committee. The Session invites the Interim; he/she is not voted upon by the congregation. This committee will be selected at the January 15, 2020 Session meeting. Matches for the church and Interim will be provided by the Presbytery.

-A church self-study will be conducted under the guidance of the selected Interim Pastor. Session will then create a Ministry Information Form (church profile)

-Upon completion of the church self-study and the MIF, Rev. McGhee will lead a discussion on selecting the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) which is elected by the congregation.

The church will receive names of possible "matches" from the Presbytery when the search process begins. After reviewing the Pastor Information Form (PIF) of the pastoral candidates, the PNC will decide if it is interested in contacting him/her.

NOTES OF INTEREST

Music Notes

Perotin, a French composer who flourished around 1200 in Paris, was central to the development of church music. The earliest music of the church, as preserved in the *Liber Usualis*, is monophonic chant, a single line. Perotin and some of his contemporaries began adding other lines to be sung alongside the monophonic chants. These pieces, in their early stages, were called organa (singular organum). The original chant was often sung in very long notes. This line was called the "Tenor," coming from the Latin "to hold," because the notes were held for long durations. A voice that was added to the Tenor would be called Duplum. If another voice were added it would be called Triplum, and the next would be called Quadruplum. The organum, "Siderunt," comes from the Gradual for St. Stephen's Day. A youtube video is linked below.

To our modern ears, this music may sound other-worldly and might just as easily have been avant-garde instead of ancient. It is fascinating to ponder what life in the church must have been like when Perotin was composing. How far we've come!

Like Mrs. Moffett and the watermelon man, may we always be ready to share our Christian faith.
