Cameron Carpenter is perhaps the most theatrical organ recitalist of our time. He is antithetical to virtually every church organist I've ever known in that he, never having desired to be a church organist, prefers the electric organ to the pipe organ. His arguments are simple-- the pipe organ is not portable and it goes out of tune. While this opinion warrants a certain amount of ire from his church music "colleagues," his exceptional technique and imaginative use of the instrument can not be denied. In anticipation of July 4th, I have decided to share with you a youtube video of Cameron Carpenter playing John Philip Sousa's march, *The Stars and Stripes Forever*. I have often heard this piece played on the organ to finish a recital, but never like this. Pay particular attention to where he puts the piccolo solo.
