### PENTECOST OFFERING

During Pentecost, we celebrate that the Holy Spirit has opened the doors to faith in Jesus Christ. Just as many of us were nurtured in faith during our youth, we give to this special offering to build a foundation of faith in new generations.

The Pentecost Offering unites us in a church-wide effort to support young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world. Our support today helps nurture the faith of those who are the church to come — children, youth, and young adults.

Forty percent stays with our congregation to develop and support programs for young people in our own church and community.

### Music Notes

My recent trip to Bulgaria with the Hanover College Choir presented me with many experiences I expect I'll remember for the rest of my life. We visited several Orthodox Churches and performed in an Evangelical Methodist Church. The Orthodox Churches were stunning. I felt as if I were stepping into Heaven. Every wall and ceiling was covered with paintings of Jesus, Mary, saints or angels. A friend of mine, a scholar of the Orthodox tradition, suggested that my experience was exactly the point. The design of the worship space is intended to represent a colonization of Heaven on earth.

We also had the opportunity to perform with several Bulgarian choirs. One of the more fascinating choirs was the folk choir we joined in Plovdiv. The singers in this choir undergo a training completely different from the singing we learn in the West. It is unique to Bulgaria and is a sound unlike any I'd ever heard before. I have found a youtube video of a similar choir (link below) singing one of the folk songs we performed with the choir from Plovdiv.

As far as I can tell, these singers sing with a lowered soft palate (an absolute no-no in western singing) and place the voice as forward as possible. The result is a wide and resonant sound with tremendous overtone development. I hope you enjoy the video.
