Our Peace & Global Witness Offering will be received on October 7, World Communion Sunday. Highlights of Session Meeting August 15, 2018

- Use of sanctuary for Community Choir practices on October 1, 8, 15, and 22 for the fall choir concert was approved.
- Congregational meeting for Sept 23rd to approve the slate of officers for the class of 2021 was approved.
- Personnel has determined that Jonathan Stanley will continue as salary for the position of Music Director and hourly for the position of Office Manager.
- The Nursery will be moved to the old preschool rooms
- A Birthday Pitch-In will be hosted by the Fellowship Committee on October 14th after worship.
- Fellowship Committee is soliciting quotes for new countertops and cabinets for the kitchen which will be completed using a \$5000 anonymous donation given for the kitchen updates.
- A Red Cross Blood Drive will be held in Fellowship Hall on October 4th.
- The five communion table pieces that were replated are back in the Sanctuary.

Pastor Scott will be out of the office from Monday, October 15th through Sunday, October 21st.

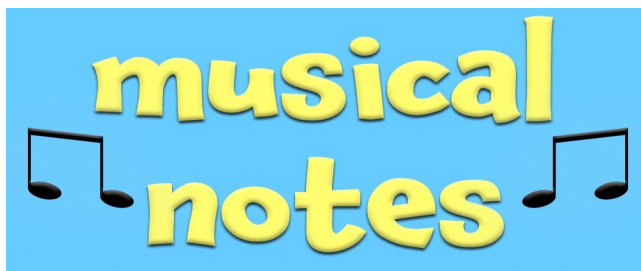

Highlights of Session Meeting September 19, 2018

- Use of Fellowship Hall for Tri Kappa meetings on the second Monday of each month from October-June (excluding January) from 6:00-9:00 p.m. was approved.
- Notice from the City of Madison Zoning Board of Appeals for a Variance Permit at 301 W. 2nd Street by Historic Madison, INC (for a permit for on-street parking for office space) was received and read. A hearing on this matter will be held on October 9, 2018, at 5:30 p.m. in the City Hall Building at 101 W. Main.
- Pastor Scott Hookey will attend Boundary Training on October 1st in Mitchell, IN.
- Pastor Hookey will be out from October 15-21.
- Celebration of Baptism for Opal Becerra, daughter of Madison Porter Becerra and Jose Becerra, will take place on September 30. Mark Porter will perform the ceremony for his great-granddaughter.
- An additional anonymous donation of \$2000 toward the kitchen updates, making a total of \$7000, was received. Fellowship Committee received approval to replace all cabinets and countertops, sinks, faucets, and hardware, plus plumbing. Approximately \$800 additional dollars will be needed. The committee will be researching the costs and options for replacing the flooring. This will also require additional funding and is only under consideration.
- The Stewardship Campaign will begin in November and will again include the per capita tax donations. This was very successful and greatly appreciated last year.
- A meeting will be offered to new members and all interested members to explain the budget and the workings of the church stewardship.
- General Fund and Capital Fund reports were presented and approved.
- Personnel is looking for a nursery attendant.
- A Confirmation Class for our youth in grades six and seven will be starting after the new year. Christian Education will be budgeting for curriculum and for these youth to attend a Confirmation Retreat in April at Pyoca as a culminating activity.
- A Congregational Meeting will be held on September 23rd to approve the Class of 2021 church officers for Elders, Deacons, and Trustee.
- The 5th Thursday meal, sponsored by Membership and ACES, was held on August 30th. It was a great success with 24 attendees. There will be another 5th Thursday meal on Nov. 29th.



In the month of October, the service music will come from 17th and 18th Century Italy. Composers such as Frescobaldi, Trabacci, Cavazonni, and Zipoli wrote toccatas, canzonas, ricercare, fantasias, and capriccios. Toccatas come in two varieties. The fast toccatas present fast moving lines over slow harmonic changes. In contrast, elevation toccatas, presented during the communion service, will typically contain slow and dissonant chords. The dissonance of these pieces is mitigated by the gentle, undulating registration. Girolamo Frescobaldi's crowning achievement, "Fiori Musicali," is a setting of three organ masses. The elevation toccata from the Mass of the Apostles, linked below, is especially lovely.
